Common today, totally unheard of then!

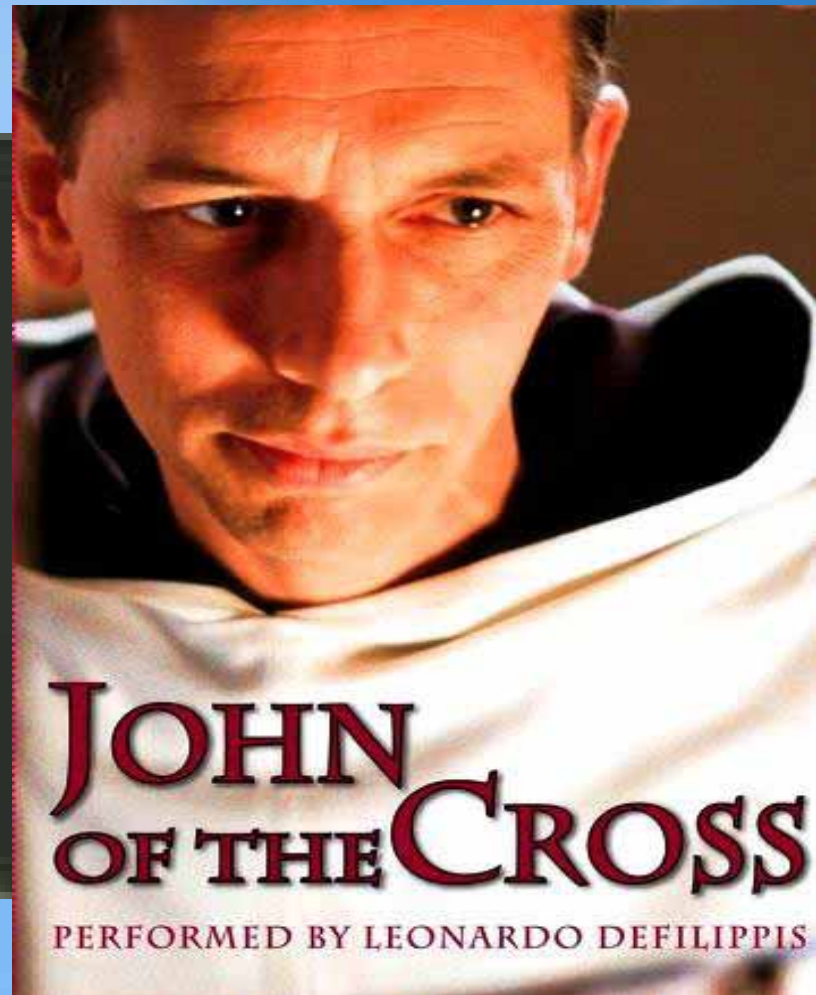
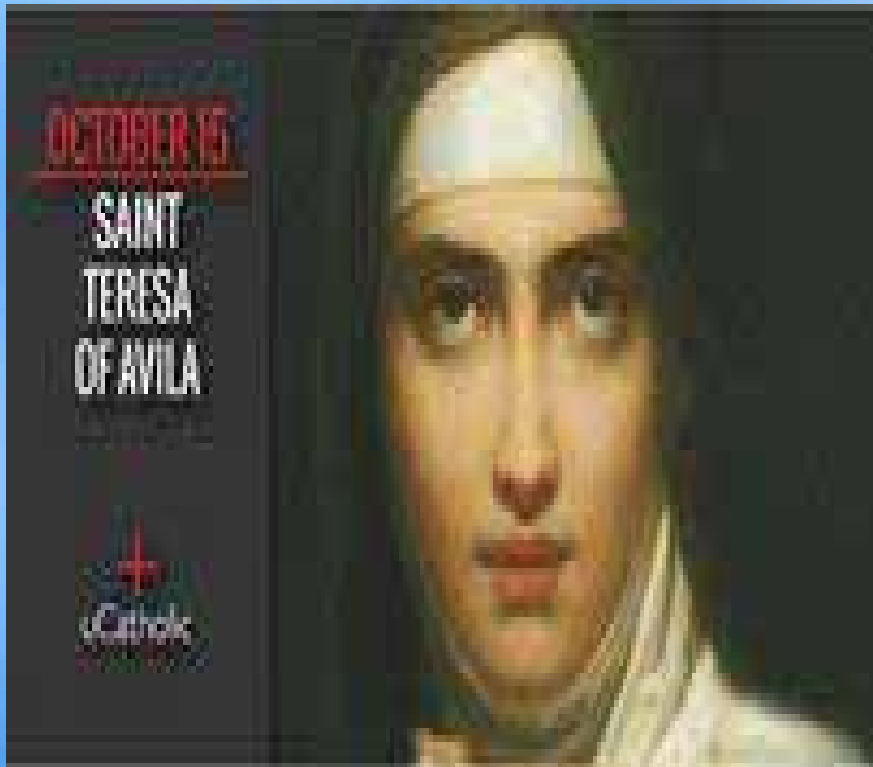


2. Super Saints

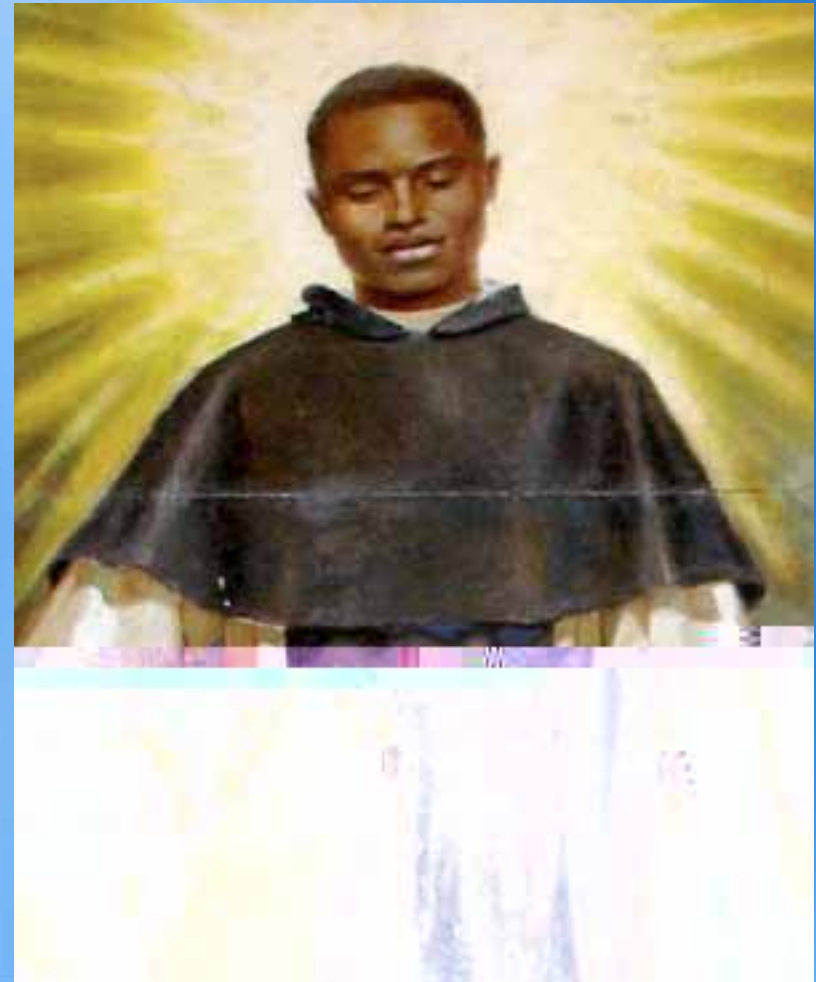

Justification

Peace of Augsburg/ Council of Trent

Root causes of the Reformation

- 1. Nationalism:** Cultural, Social, Political and Economic shifts in Europe. The inevitable clash between the powers of Rome and nation states.
- 2. Problems & Abuses:** Indulgences, building projects, Clergy as more civil authority than pastoral and spiritual servants.

Later, Theological Differences will lead to a wide split.

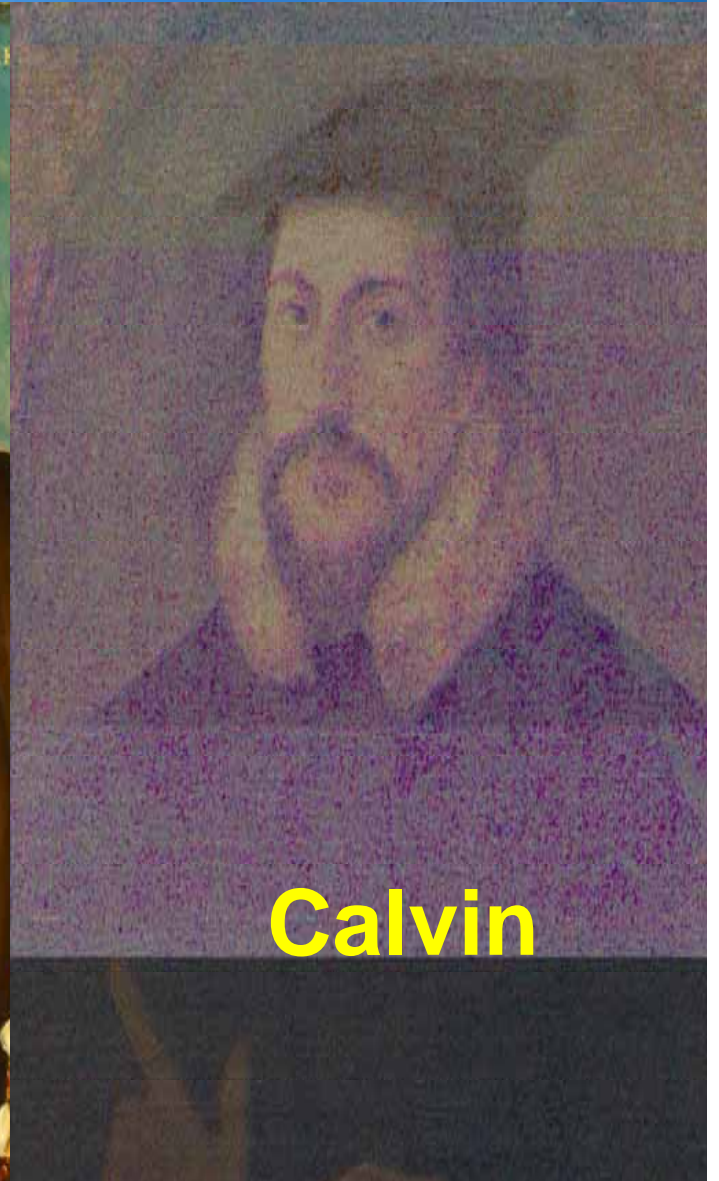

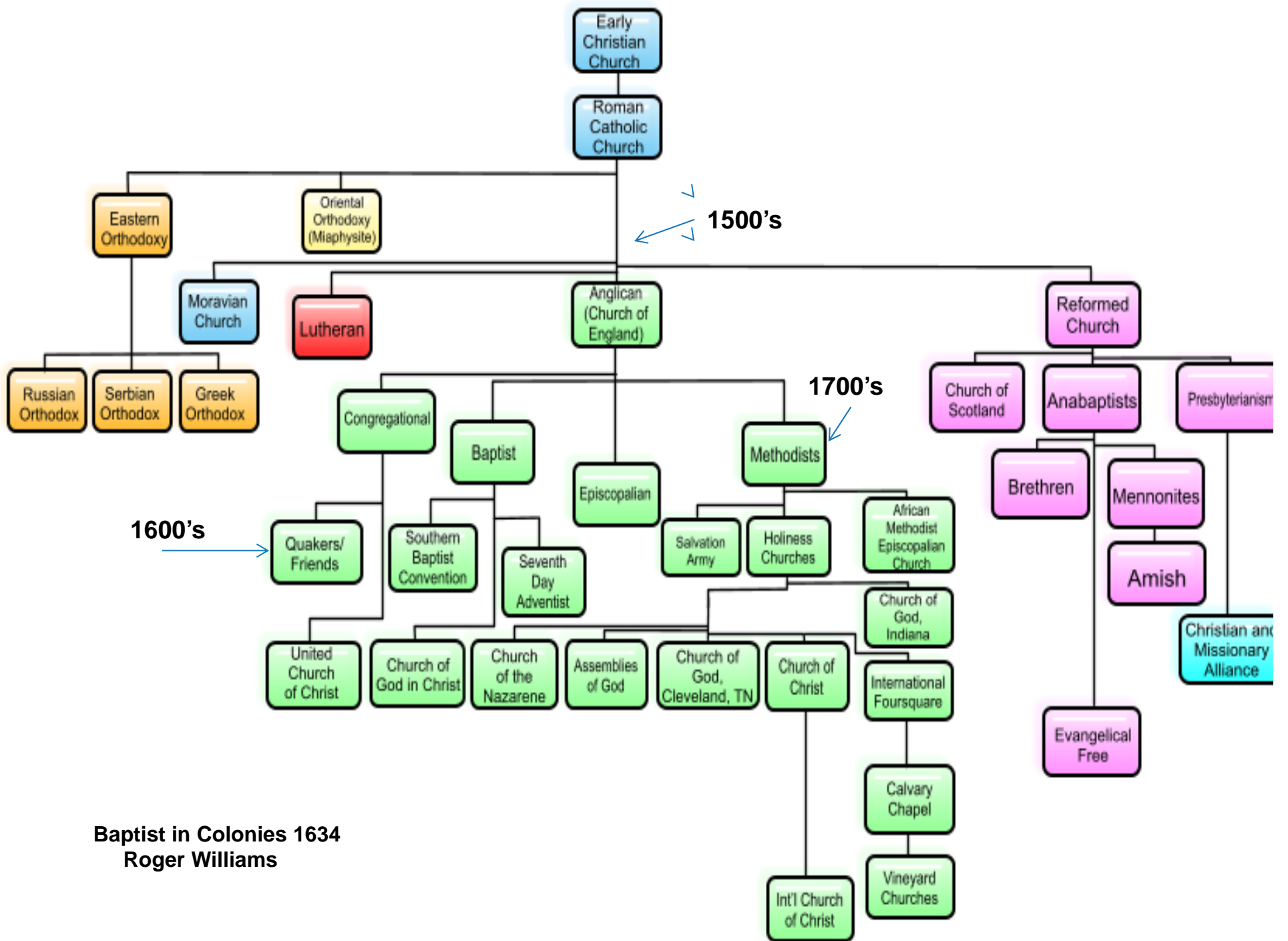
