


#### 1. Explorers, Missionaries, Traders


#### 1400 to 1700

- **B. FRANCE** Centered in **Quebec**/ spread across the Great Lakes, Miss. River and New England. (**Jesuits**)








Hispanic or Latino ethnicity 2010 U.S. Census

Ark & Dove ships bring them 1630.


**Baltimore** is the first Diocese 1789.


John Carroll is the first Bishop.

1880-1920: Open Immigration Laws start

waves of Catholics flooding into the US. (millions)

1870- GERMAN: NY and on to mid-West, Texas

1880- IRISH: All over the Northeast, on to west

1900- ITALIAN: New York state

1905- Poles/Slavs: Poland, Eastern Europe, moved to northeast and mid-west

1920- Latin America

(1920-22 The doors are closed!)

These are not the wealthy, educated, protestant looking Catholics of Maryland 1700's.

They want to retain their ethnic roots, language, customs and faith.

Anti-Catholic hatred is wide spread.




# MOLLY MAGUIRE EXECUTIONS

On June 21, 1877, four "Molly Maguires," an alleged secret society of Irish mineworkers, were hanged here. Pinkerton detective James McParlan's testimony led to convictions for violent crimes against the coal industry, yet the facts of labor, class, and ethnic conflicts, even the existence of the organization, remain contested. Six others were hanged on this day at the county jail in Pottsville; ten more were executed in Pa. through 1879.










#### Largest Ancestry: 2000

- 1762 The English take Cuba, a deal is made... English control of Florida begins.

Until future Catholic descendants of the immigrant waves retire in sunny Florida!


