


How do we respond?

- Offering- free gift of mercy
- Communion- binds us to God & each other
- Feast- taste of heavenly banquet

- Transubstantiation




- "I am the bread of life" vs.34




Consider our history:

- Attacked heresies and they clearly defended it.
- For 10 centuries after Christ all Christians held this belief.

Reconciliation



Reconciliation

In all our relationships there will be a need to ask for forgiveness. We are imperfect. The knowledge of our sin by the other only deepens the relationship. We must freely reveal our whole self, good and bad.

Talk is cheap, action and more action!

No matter the relationship, God, self or others.

Reconciliation

Important note:

Shame vs. Guilt

Guilt says: This <u>action/choice</u> was wrong. It harmed me, others and/or my relationship with God. (False guilt?)

Shame says: You are bad or wrong. You are unworthy of love or forgiveness.

Guilt is good! How so?

Means:

I do know right from wrong.

I do care if my actions cause harm.

I have a properly formed conscience.

I am a morally responsible human being.

I am not a psychopath! (Always good to know.)

Do not fear confession

"Be not afraid!"

The powerful healing action of his great mercy and forgiveness is offered to us!


