Corpus Christi SUNDAY

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the midthirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast is celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist.

At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

Faith Formation has completed the 2019-2020 year. As plans for reopening are being made, please watch the bulletin and our website for updates for the 2020-2021 School Year.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION:

BAPTISM: Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered for registered members of Saint John XXIII and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact the office at (239) 561-2245 for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Please contact Chris at 561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, contact Chris at (239) 561-7499 to begin the process.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. The feast dates to the Middle Ages and originated with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle.

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He was affected by the growing debate among certain theologians who, for the first time in the history of the Church, began introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal.



Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was nearby in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain today.

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist, to which she had a great devotion.

After many years of trying, she finally convinced the bishop, the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, where none had existed before. Soon after her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

Inspired by the miracle, Pope Urban commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.





WAYS TO RESPOND TO COMMON ABORTION QUESTIONS:

"WHAT ABOUT RAPE & INCEST?"

- Rape and incest account for 2% of all abortions. It's bizarre
 to say, "Let's kill 98% of children in the womb because...
 there's some other child who might have been conceived as
 a result of rape or incest." In other words, what about the
 98% that aren't conceived via rape and incest?
- Do the conditions of your conception decide what species you are? Of course not. If they did, then all poor people would be sterilized to make sure they don't give birth. (Oh, wait! That was Margaret Sanger's and Marie Scope's mantra. They were the racists who started Planned Parenthood and Marie Stopes International, respectively.)
- Are you uncomfortable about the death penalty for rapists and murders? Then why would you wish to execute the innocent child of a rapist?
- It is true that the child might be the progeny of a rapist, but we know for certain that the child also belongs to her mother. Killing your own child to be free of a memory which, as everyone admits, can never be effectively removed from a woman's mind, is cutting off your nose to spite your face. Many women who have had abortions suffer depression because of their "right to choose death" one often forced upon them by a husband or boyfriend.

"A WOMEN HAS A RIGHT TO CONTROL HER OWN BODY"

• No one has ever said differently. Outside of Islam and Islamic law, where a woman's worth is often treated as only a fraction of that of a man, nobody wishes to control women. - Pregnancy centers offer free classes in parenting to expectant mothers and fathers.

Pro-life pregnancy centers drew nearly 2 million clients in 2017 and provided more than \$161 million in free services. More than 24,000 clients received support after an abortion, including counseling and referral to professional help when needed.

"WHAT ABOUT POVERTY?"

 Cure poverty. Don't kill humans. Killing poor people will definitely "cure" poverty, but that's inhumane and senseless. Further, at what point is someone poor? When they can't afford a summer vacation? When they can't afford their \$150 monthly cable bill or the newest iPhone model? Poverty isn't an issue in a welfare state. All children, including those of the poor, are human, welcomed and valued. Humans are never disposable.

"SHE'S NOT READY TO BE A PARENT"

No one is ready to be a parent. It's called "baptism by fire."
What could possibly be so important that the death of her child
is the answer? Finishing college? Running for political office?
Bringing peace to the Middle East? All of these jobs can be
accomplished while pregnant and with children in tow.

"WHAT IF IT'S AN INCONVENIENT PREGNANCY?"

 We live in a universe in which we must become morally responsible and logically consistent in order to become logical, morally responsible adults. It behooves no one, especially the murdered child, to say, "Sorry, honey! I'm more important than you are and I've got places to be!"

"WHAT ABOUT INFANT DISABILITIES?"

- So the child isn't as "perfect" as you had hoped? Take a ticket and get in line. No one is perfect. Must all children possessing a normal range of intelligence (90% of the world's population) be killed to make room for the übermenschen of your utopic and eugenic imagination? I doubt many abortionists would be eager to sacrifice their own lives for the sake of someone "more worthy" than herself for the sake of the species. This is simply narcissism, plain and simple.
- If your child or loved one were to "become" less than perfect
 at a later time due to disease or accident, would the proabortionist be as eager to kill them then? Looking at a disabled
 person and seeing how they fall short of your own supposed
 perfection is an atrocious standard by which to make moral
 judgments.




