Praying FOR ALL Souls

On Tuesday, November 2, we will celebrate All Souls Day, but for Catholics the entire month of November is dedicated to praying for the souls in Purgatory.

Purgatory is the name the Church gives to the final purification after death and judgment, a period when those who die in God's grace and friendship undergo a purification to achieve the holiness necessary to enter into the joy of heaven. All souls in Purgatory are assured of eternal salvation, but they must first be cleansed of all their lesser sins before they can enter the glory of heaven.

But what about those souls we don't think were in a state of grace when they died? Should we continue to pray for our loved ones who were fallen-away Catholics? Our atheist friends? Or what about those (uncanonized) people who lived such holy lives that we figure they must already be in heaven?

When we're talking about the communion of saints and the body of Christ, there are all kinds of questions that come up with this topic, like whether we'll all enter heaven at the same time or whether it's an immediate judgment. The Catechism says there's an immediate judgment, but what does that mean when there's no time? You can kind of go cross-eyed and get a headache after a while.

So in fact, just keep praying. Never could we just give up hope and say, "Well, this person is probably in hell. I'm going to stop praying for them." That's not Christian. In fact, in the book of Romans we hear "hope against hope" – that's faith. That was Abraham's faith, and that's who Catholics are. We're the ones who hope against all hope that Jesus can purify and can save. We can't draw conclusions, we just keep praying."

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Please contact Chris at 561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.





Taking Time out to Bury the Dead

In today's fast-moving world, everything is focused on instant satisfaction — fast food, mobile banking, microwaves and instantaneous communication. Gone are the times when one would take the time to write a letter and post it knowing that it might take up to a week to be received by the intended person.

Unfortunately, this culture of getting things done as quickly as possible has impacted the way we perform the corporal works of mercy of burying the dead. Too many families approach handling death as something to get done and over with. The cheapest, fastest method of handling a deceased body is to have it cremated and either scatter the ashes to take the cremated remains home to sit on a mantle place or shelf — that is, until it is in the way and ultimately ends up in a closet or attic.

This work of mercy calls us to go beyond this simplified, speedy process. We are called to treat the dead "with respect and charity, in faith and hope of the Resurrection" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No, 2300). Offering prayers through the liturgies of vigil, funeral and committal does this. Having the remains of the deceased properly buried or entombed in a cemetery or mausoleum, either in full-body or cremated form, is a further way in which we treat the dead with respect and charity.

Our approach to those who are facing death either personally or through the death of a loved one is part of this corporal work of mercy. Take time to listen compassionately to those who are grieving. The sharing of memories is a good way for those who grieve to reconcile themselves with the loss. Remember that grieving does not end with the burial. Offer to assist with daily chores or bring meals while encouraging them to take care of themselves. Grief has no schedule. Many years after the death of a significant member in one's life grief can still take over unexpectedly. Accommodate someone in their grief while encouraging them to develop a life where their relationship with the person who has died has changed.

Having Masses said for a deceased person acknowledges the value of that person in the world and the lives of their family members. The Catholic Church celebrates The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed each year on the day following the solemnity of All Saints Day. This day, commonly referred to as All Souls' Day, calls us to remember departed loved ones in prayer and through visitation to their final resting place. Most Catholic churches and cemeteries hold special Masses on these days.

So, how do we practice the corporal works of mercy of burying the dead? By deed, word and prayer. Arrange for proper and respectful burial or entombment of the remains of the deceased. Reach out with words of compassion and love to those who are grieving, and ensure that all of the faithful departed are honored with the appropriate funeral liturgy and other Masses over time.

Follow the Challenge of Saint Martin DePorres Patron Saint of Social Justice

Some days we feel extremely challenged by the difficulties we face. In our present world we are often overwhelmed by situations we believe are beyond our control....illness, such as the Pandemic; climate change, such as massive fires, flooding; inequalities, such as poverty, massive wealth, prejudice, injustice.

And so we pray for change. God hears our prayers and God, believing in us, challenges each of us to step forward. Accepting that challenge calls us to action. It calls us to make a difference. It calls us to be Christ for one another.

We, at St. Martin De Porres, accept the challenge as did our Patron Saint nearly 500 years ago. Life today is not entirely different than it was in the time of St. Martin. Poverty, inequality and prejudice remain as big a detraction today as it did back then.

A pious young man named Martin De Porres of Lima, Peru met the challenge of poverty and discrimination in the 1500s. Born to a Spanish nobleman and a slave of African and Native descent, Martin faced rejection throughout his life. In his early life, his father left the family and his mother strived to keep Martin and his younger sister fed and protected. He was sent away for schooling to be trained as a barber and a medical helper. Upon completion, Martin sought refuge as a helper at the Dominican Priory in Lima. While accepted as a kitchen helper, he was denied acceptance as a Dominican Brother because of his race.

Martin flourished in his role at the Priory and spent his off hours in service to the needs of the people in his extended community. People were fed, people were tended to in time of illness and, most important, people were lifted in prayer as Martin devoted much of the night in conversation with God. And miracles took place.

Recognizing Martin's personal relationship with God, the Dominican hierarchy finally welcomed him to join them as a Dominican Brother though priesthood remained out of the question because of his ethnicity.

Over the course of his life, Martin dedicated himself to being Christ for others. His outreached arms welcomed the mighty and the poor, the saintly and the sinner for in each he saw the face of Jesus.

Two hundred years after his death, Martin De Porres was beatified by Pope Gregory and was declared a Saint by Pope John XXIII in 1962. We celebrate his Feast Day on November 3rd.

We welcome all to join us as we volunteer our services to benefit those who seek our assistance as well as our compassion, understanding and Christ's love as confirmed by the actions of our beloved Patron Saint.



BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

A PRAYER

Against Cancer

Lord Jesus Christ,

We call upon Your blessed name and we pray for Your merciful heart to surround us with love, strength and courage.

We ask that Your hands touch those with the power of healing.

May they be directed to the right treatment in Your blessed name as we ask You Lord to represent the physicians, doctors and medical care aids and administer them in Your spirit.

May every cancerous cell be cast out and replaced with a good one. May every spot of this deadly cell be wiped out by Your powerful hands.

Amen.

Survival Rate: Between 1989 and 2015, death from breast cancer went down 39 percent among women in the U.S. In that time, 320,000 more people survived breast cancer. In fact, more than 3.5 million breast cancer survivors live in the U.S. today.

Early Detection: More people are surviving breast cancer because they're finding the cancer sooner (a.k.a. early detection) and getting effective treatment. There are three ways we can all increase our chances of finding cancer early if we ever get it (so we can treat it as soon as possible). Those are to know our risk, know our normal and get screened regularly.

Risk Factors - History: Overall, non-Hispanic black women are less likely to get breast cancer than non-Hispanic white women. But for women under 40, the opposite is true—non-Hispanic black women are more likely to get breast cancer than non-Hispanic white women. The median age at diagnosis for black women is 59, compared to 63 for white women. Whether it's due to gene mutations like BRCA1/2, similar lifestyles or other family traits, if someone in your family has had breast cancer, other members have a higher risk. That's why it's so important to talk to both your mother's and father's relatives about family health history and other factors that might affect your family's risk.

Risk Factors - Age: Family history and gene mutations increase the risk of breast cancer, but they're just a piece of the puzzle. The biggest risk factors for breast cancer are being female and getting older. That means we all need to take charge of our breast health, whatever our family history.

Men at Risk: Breast cancer in men is rare, but it happens. Men whose families have a history of breast cancer are at higher risk and may even benefit from regular screening. All men should talk to their doctor if they ever notice a change to their chests or nipples. It's also important to know if a man in your family has had breast cancer since it may mean other family members have a higher risk.

Taking Charge: Taking care of your health is always a good idea, but there's no magic guarantee against breast cancer. When it comes to cancer, the best defense really is a good offense.

There are no guarantees against breast cancer, but there are ways to reduce your risk. Getting exercise and minimizing alcohol are a great start. For new, soon-to-be, and some-day moms, breastfeeding can also reduce your risk. People at higher risk may be able to take medication or even get surgery to bring their risk down. And we can all increase our chances of surviving breast cancer if we get it by taking action to catch any problems early. That means understanding our risk, getting on a regular screening schedule and getting checked out if you ever notice a change in your breasts.
