November is National Adoption Month

November is National Adoption Month. But what is adoption? We often hear about it, particularly as one of two alternatives to the injustice of abortion. Millions of us are the recipients of this incredible gift, where our birthparent(s) turned the unplanned into a loving plan. Yet, there are still so many misconceptions about it.

Adoption happens because of brokenness. In the natural and the supernatural, this courageous act of love and selflessness helps to bring healing, hope and wholeness. It was God's plan to reconcile us to Himself as evidenced in Ephesians 1:4-5: "For He chose us in Him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. In love He predestined us for adoption to sonship (or daughtership) through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will."

There is no salvation without adoption. So, Christians, especially, should understand adoption in a deeply

spiritual and personal way. Adoption is the essence of salvation. In the natural, we shouldn't think of it as a last resort. Sometimes, it should be the first resort.

But the way we understand adoption skews the way we apply it in our society. Perhaps, it explains why there were only 110,373 adoptions in 2014 (the latest year reported by the National Council for Adoption, or NCFA) yet 926,200 abortions. In 2007, according to the same NCFA report, there were 133,737 adoptions. So, total adoptions in the U.S. have fallen. Part of the decline is due to a reduction in international adoptions, but the fact remains that the number of infant adoptions was only 18,329 and 57,397 children in foster care (in 2014) who were available for adoption weren't adopted. The most recent stats reveal that out of the 117,794 foster children available for adoption in 2016, 57,208 were thankfully adopted; 60,586 precious vulnerable children were not.



Adoption CONTINUED

No child should languish in foster care. No mother should feel that the violence of abortion is even an option. Our pregnancy centers, in all of the incredible frontline work they do to protect mothers, fathers and their children, aren't enough to create a culture that values Life and encourages adoption. Our churches must do a better job leading in the defense of Life, at its most vulnerable, in what the Book of James declares as pure religion: "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world."

Although the United States is not engaged in a militaristic war within our borders, we have a cultural and spiritual war that has caused more casualties than all of our military wars—combined. There have been over 60 million killed since abortion was "legalized" in this country. Roe v. Wade never empowered women. It empowers men to have sex and run. This has led to a massive culture of abandonment where women are effectively left behind as widows, and children in the womb are orphaned by both the absent father and the mother who has chosen to give into the distress caused by pro-abortion propaganda. The pollution of this world is the warped belief system that others, not the Author of Life, can determine your worth. We allow our minds and hearts to be polluted by the lie that we aren't created with purpose and that we can't be stronger than our circumstances. I don't know about you, but I serve the God of the Impossible. I've living proof of the impossible becoming possible. My birthmom was raped yet bravely rejected the violence of abortion, choosing Life and adoption, instead. Philippians 4:13 proclaims: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

The same Christ who was humanly "unplanned". In fact, I was recently struck as I read Matthew 1:1-16 about the birth of Christ. I have read this many times throughout my life, but something profound happened to me this time. It's not Mary's genealogy that is detailed in the opening chapter. It is the genealogy of the man who would become Jesus' adoptive father—Joseph. Christ's lineage was drawn from a man who was not genetically tied to him, at all. The paradigm of adoption was revealed in a courageous teen mother with a humanly unplanned pregnancy (certainly Divinely planned), a father who chose to love rather than to leave, and a Savior who would sacrifice himself in order to offer redemption, adoption and transformation to those who confess and believe.

Adoption is courageous and messy and joyful and mysterious and loving. We need to uplift all of those in this beautiful triad—the birthmom/birthdad, adoptee and adoptive family. No one's pretending it's easy. Parenting biological children isn't easy, unless I missed the memo that genetically-related children present no problems in life.

Adoption doesn't just change the child. It changes the family, the community, and sometimes...the world. Look at the late CEO of Apple, Steve Jobs. He was adopted and loved, too. And he, inarguably, changed the world.

This November, and every month, may we rethink false narratives on adoption. May we look at this act for what it is...transformative love. I'm a firm believer that's there's always a 'plan' in the 'unplanned'. What we don't see from a human perspective, God knows from a Divine perspective. We're meant to be, regardless of the circumstances of our conception, regardless of our real or perceived abilities or disabilities, regardless of what others think we contribute to this world. We have equal and irrevocable worth simply because we exist. And adoption is a powerful and culture-changing way to unleash that God-given Purpose.



FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Please contact Chris at 561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. TOM LABANAUSKAS - DIRECTOR OF MUSIC MINISTRIES

About Tom:

Musically gifted and multi-talented, Tom Labanauskas began his musical journey at the age of 5, beginning with organ lessons and then moving on to both organ and piano lessons. Tom was a member of the Children's Choir at his parish, St. Bernard's in Homer Glen, Illinois, from the age of 8 until age 12. At the age of 11, he began taking flute lessons at nearby Lewis University and by age 13 was playing at Church Masses, and often substituted in the organist's absence.

Upon entering Providence Catholic High School, in New Lenox, Illinois, Tom joined the Providence Catholic Band and was the piano accompanist for the Providence Catholic School Choir. In his junior year, the Providence Catholic Marching Band was resurrected and Tom became the first drum major of the Providence Catholic Marching Band in 21 years, leading the band to win 1st place trophies at competitions and festivals. During his years at Providence, Tom also provided the music for all the school Masses, musicals, and special events. As a senior, Tom's musical achievements were recognized and he was awarded the prestigious John Phillip Sousa Band Award, presented to the most outstanding music student.

Tom went on to DePaul University School of Music in Chicago where he studied Performing Arts Management. While attending college, Tom took on the position of accompanist at St. Emeric Catholic Church in Country Club Hills, Illinois. After two years, Tom was named Director of Music at St. Emeric at the age of 19, and was the youngest music director in the state of Illinois, at that time.

In February of 2003, Tom became Director of Music at St. Jude Catholic Church in New Lenox, Illinois. The St. Jude Music Ministry, under Tom's direction, was composed of six different choirs with a total of over 100 choir members,

ranging in age from 7-97. Under his direction, the Youth Choir and Handbell Choir were created, both of which were enthusiastically supported. The former Adult Choir was transitioned to a more formal group, becoming known as the St Jude Chorale. Under Tom's direction an annual Christmas tradition was begun during the Advent season featuring a Christmas Cantata combining all the musical choirs of the St. Jude Music Ministry, an orchestra, guest vocalist of the Chicago Lyric Opera and Chicago Symphony Chorus, guest choirs of other churches and schools together to sing and play Christmas songs along with readings of the Gospel proclaiming the birth of Jesus. In addition to the Christmas Cantatas, an Easter Cantata performance was added and performed during Holy Week.

In addition to the church, Tom has been a member of various orchestras, choral piano accompanist (most recently the Grand Prairie Singers of Homewood/Flossmoor, Illinois), and playing engagements for weddings, formal dinners, cocktail hours, reunions and the list goes on. At present, Tom is the resident pianist/organist for the Naperville Winds a symphonic band located in Naperville, Illinois.

Through Tom's musical talent and skills, he hopes to continue a sense of meaning and awareness of the music brought to the liturgies at St. John XXIII. One of Tom's goals is to attain an increase in the amount of participation, not only with those who are involved in the Music Ministry, but also by those in the pews who are enthusiastically singing. At each Mass celebration, it is a hope to fill the rafters with a wide variety of classic traditional hymns as well as the most current Christian songs.

Tom is very dedicated to furthering the efforts of the Music Ministry and is anxious to see this much loved and supported ministry further expand and blossom.





Each month during this special year, we will feature an interview with a member of the St. John XXIII parish whose life reflects the virtues and characteristics of St. Joseph.



BRIAN DOWNEY

attorney at law, devoted husband of Rebecca for 12 years and father of three children, ranging in age from 11-7, believes that St. Joseph serves as a role model in his life as husband and father. "Not having a whole lot of information of St. Joseph from scripture, I've always viewed him as husband/father working hard for the betterment of his family, as best he could according to God's



will, willing to do what it took to put his family in the best possible positions. As a father I try to do the same with as little fanfare as possible."

Brian's wife shares his zeal for betterment of the family by deepening her faith commitment and by helping other women do the same. Rebecca is session facilitator for Walking with Purpose Bible Study, a group that recognizes a need for greater support for young Catholic moms. These Bible study sessions are open to women of all ages, featuring small group sessions comprised of 8-10 women.

A former member of the parish finance committee and a current board member of the SW Florida Free Pain Clinic, Brian sees special challenges facing men serving in his role today. "I believe the greatest challenge is attempts by secular society to downplay the role of the nuclear family in creating a cohesive, functioning society." He credits the church for helping him carry out and support his paternal and leadership role "by being a strong voice for value of the nuclear family."

For Brian the reward of his role as husband and father outweighs the challenges. "The reward is learning how to put one's will and desires in second place. This is our call from God, to serve and desire His ways, and not our ways, and there is no better earthly teacher than raising a family."



WE NEED TO RETURN TO WEEKLY MASS

The pandemic has interrupted our Sunday Mass routine. Sitting in our living room is too convenient but not what worship calls us to. So, unless you're someone who needs to stay home for health reasons, each of us has to understand the importance of gathering together live.

Gathering together is not the most important thing we do, but the important thing cannot happen unless we personally gather together.

Our Bible consistently teaches that the church is Christ's body (Eph. 1:22-23). Each believer is a different body part, but we're intricately knitted together. We're not independent but interdependent. When we gather together, we make Christ present (Matt. 18:20). It is for this presence that Jesus calls us together - together with Him in our midst, He brings us to God, the Father. With His presence we celebrate our Mass, our Eucharist, where we worship God, as the Body of Christ, where we are given the very Body of Christ in Communion, that we may continue to be the Body of Christ in the world. This is the important reason for gathering together live. Comfortably watching from our living rooms cannot be a substitute for this.

When we are physically present, we welcome people who may never be our friends. What we have in common is far more than blood, far more than the mutual affection of friends. What we have in common is Baptism in Christ. That's it. That's all that matters here. That's why rich and

poor should be sitting side by side. Every barrier society erects to keep us apart is worthless here. Every bond society builds up to put us into this little group or that clan or the other club is also worthless here. All the externals are gone. All that we wear is Christ. We all wear the Christ Who we were Baptized into.

When we stay home, we still can listen and see Mass celebrated, but it is not what baptism calls us to. Watching Mass meets a need during a pandemic but watching Mass cannot acquire what only physical presence can. Holding firm to our understanding that it is we who make Jesus present when we gather together, should impel us to take seriously why St. John XXIII needs to have us be physically present.

Sunday Mass is what we do together. That isn't a theory that will work no matter how we look, how we sound, how we act. It isn't a theory, it's practice. The church has to get itself together. If we work at it, all of us, maybe we'll come to a time when we'll walk through the door and, without even thinking about it, head for the empty place closest to the altar. If we work at it, we won't have to imagine that we are one in Christ; we'll act like we are.

Please encourage others to return in person to our worship, to our church, to our parish. All of us are needed. All of us make up the very Body of Christ.

BEWARE Suspicious Packages Arriving by Mail




