

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

During the Advent season, families should spend time together preparing for the approaching celebration of the birth of Christ. An Advent wreath can be a great focal point for family prayers and holiday celebrations.

An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles that are lighted successively in weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought to the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. A rose-colored candle is used to mark the Third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Children love the beauty of the simple traditional ceremony. Lighting candles in an Advent wreath is a simple way to start a tradition of family worship in the home. Those who participate will cherish the experience all their lives.

Prayer:

Each day your family should gather around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. The proper number of candles are then lighted and a prayer is said.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath:

It starts at the evening meal on the Saturday before the first Sunday in Advent with the blessing of the wreath. (The head of the household is the one designated to say the prayer, following which various members of his family light the candles. If the group is not a family, then a leader may be selected to say the prayers and other appointed to light the candles.) The following prayer can be used:

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming Christ and may receive from You abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water.

The following prayer which is said before the evening meal each night of the first week of Advent:

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, That by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION:

BAPTISM: Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered for registered members of St. John XXIII and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact the office at **(239) 561-2245** for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Please contact Chris at 561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, contact Chris at (239) 561-7499 to begin the process.

Having already received the Holy Spirit, how do we finally grasp what Jesus is about and what our role is?

Understanding and grasping the purpose of the Liturgical Year can make the difference. The three-year cycle of Liturgical Seasons, Sunday Scriptures, and homilies, just like the three years that Jesus had forming His disciples, can only make a difference if we really believe that power of the Holy Spirit is ours. But it takes an ongoing commitment from each of us.

Jesus asks His disciples: "Do you still not understand?" (Mk 8:21)

Advent begins a new Liturgical Year. If we start now, we too have three years. What difference will these years make? The richness of our Liturgical Year shapes us, if we are willing to take the steps of change, perhaps even serious change. Changes rarely happen overnight, but if we imagine the three-year cycle, many possibilities emerge.

First, we must reevaluate the secular culture we feel far too comfortable in.

Advent has merely become the countdown to Christmas, loosing its original purpose and challenge. Advent has been usurped, absorbed, taken over by the culture. As individuals, and collectively, we are caught in the rush and drive towards Christmas.

What if we approach Advent as a new opportunity to do it differently?

We need to stay focused on our liturgical cycles and appreciate their rhythm and richness. Change happens in small ways until we amaze even ourselves with what can be done. We have four weeks to begin the journey. Changing the course of anything takes time.

Advent's original message was very clear: "Just as surely as Jesus came the first time, Jesus will come again...prepare the way of the Lord!" Focusing in on Jesus' humanity, from His birth, His life, His message, His rejection and His death, are the key to embracing our understanding of Jesus, one like us in ALL thing but sin. Living His humanity, totally, led to His resurrection by the Father.

Asking ourselves along the journey: **"How does** Jesus' living His humanity help me to understand my faith journey?" – Not by denying our humanity but by embracing it. Along the three year journey, I will occasionally point out directions we might take to make it a truer learning experience.

Three years from now, if we have forged ahead with this new journey, we will better understand Jesus' question: "Do you still not understand"? We will be in an entirely different place because we have had three years of our liturgical cycles challenging, probing, prodding and integrating into our very life. Three years to grow as disciples, to build the reign of God based on the very same experiences that the disciples followed when they began to create Community.

When hear the Easter stories from Acts, these can be our stories. What a culmination when we hear the year of Luke after two years of hearing two other Gospel writers, to know that the work of building God's reign was lived out in the way the Acts community lived and acted with one another. Perfect community? Hardly. Trying to be? Definitely! Trying to build God's reign? Absolutely!

It might take us three cycles of Evangelists to truly prepare for the power of the Spirit in our lives. But we will have three years of listening, examining and learning, challenged to awaken anew and take the next three-year journey. Each year better understanding: "Do you still not understand?"

GIVING TO THE CFA Through a Qualified Charitable Distribution

In 2020 the law changed, requiring those 72 years old or older to begin taking a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their individual retirement account (IRA). However, only those who will turn 70½ (born on or after July 1, 1949) in 2020 or later may wait until age 72 to begin taking required distributions. If you are currently receiving RMDs (or should be) because you are over age 70½, you must continue taking these RMDs.

To avoid paying taxes on this income while also meeting the obligation of the RMD, you may designate the distribution as a gift directly from the IRA custodian to the CFA. You can donate up to \$100,000 and married couples can donate up to \$200,000 if the spouse has a separate IRA.

Matching gifts are a type of corporate philanthropy that allows donors giving smaller donations the opportunity to maximize the impact of their donation on an organization.

Advent couldn't arrive at a more appropriate time of year. Just when we're getting geared up for special parties, homemade dishes to complement fine feasts, gift shopping, and lavish decorating, the Church reminds us to be still. To listen. To wait with God, and for Him.

It can be agonizing to wait in silence when we're used to bustling activity. Maybe we've set lofty expectations of what "must" be done, because it's a family tradition: getting that perfect photo for our Christmas cards, finding expensive gifts for our hard-to-please relatives, making grandma's pecan pie from scratch. To eliminate or substitute seems like utter failure, or at the very least, disappointment.

So we are, once again, a countercultural people as we attempt to retreat inward, slow down, and ponder the treasure nestled within Mary's womb. We don't like to wait, but wait we must. Only this time, during Advent, our waiting is intentional. Expectant. Anticipatory.

Most people are flippant when they have to wait. It's not about exercising charity in our demeanor and language. We don't always consider how we respond in situations that test our patience. Instead, we lash out at the poor cashier, construction manager, sales clerk, or receptionist. No, the world does not appreciate the value of waiting, certainly not this time of year.

But Advent waiting accesses a less primal part of us, namely, our souls. We're invited into a pregnant waiting instead of the "hurry up and wait" mentality of the current cultural climate. This spiritual expectancy differs from the secular understanding of its desire to eschew any opportunity, self-imposed or otherwise – to pause and ponder.

We can grow during our spiritual hiatuses. These include patience, practice, and perseverance: three very key virtues and disciplines (as in the case of practice) that will aid you in your Advent journey.






DECEMBER 8
