

KEEP Christ IN Christmas

When the clock strikes midnight on December 26, radio stations turn off Christmas music and department stores box up their Christmas displays. But for us as Christians, Christmas has only just begun. Here are 10 tips for keeping Christ in Christmas:

1. KNOW WHEN THE CHRISTMAS SEASON ACTUALLY ENDS

The joy of Christmas cannot be contained to just one day or one Mass. The Christmas season lasts until the Catholic Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord, which this year is January 10.

2. LISTEN TO CHRISTMAS MUSIC

Pull out your CDs (old-fashioned, right?) or make a Spotify playlist. Listen to Christmas music that lifts your heart and mind to God, especially now that you will not hear Christmas music on the radio.

3. ATTEND DAILY MASS

The Octave of Christmas — through January 1 — is one of the richest times of the liturgical year. Come to Mass to celebrate St. Stephen, the Holy Family, the Holy Innocents, St. Thomas Beckett, and Mary, the Mother of God on January 1.

4. KEEP YOUR CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS ON DISPLAY

While it may be tacky to leave the Christmas lights up year-round, at least keep them up through Jan. 10. Some prefer to keep decorations up until the celebration of the Presentation of Jesus on February 2.

5. INVEST IN A BEAUTIFUL NATIVITY SCENE

The tradition of recreating the Nativity scene goes back to St. Francis of Assisi. Every Catholic household should have a Nativity scene, either inside or outside. It does not have to be fancy, but it is a good way to remember the One who Christmas is all about.

6. LET THE THREE WISE MEN TAKE THEIR JOURNEY

The Three Wise Men did not arrive on Christmas Day. Bring them on a journey a little closer to the stable each day between Christmas and the Epiphany on January 3. This would be a good task for the little ones in the house!

7. SAY "MERRY CHRISTMAS!"

The cashier at your grocery store may be a bit confused to hear "Merry Christmas" in the first week of January. When they look at you sideways, just say that for Catholics, Christmas is not over vet!

8. CELEBRATE ADVENT WELL

Preparation for Christmas should not be a burden. Do you ever feel yourself letting out a sigh of relief when Christmas day is over? If so, allow Advent to be a time of spiritual preparation and not a time of stress.


9. PRAY EVERY DAY

Jesus invites all of us to a deep friendship with him. Christmas happened because Jesus wanted to live with us and show us how much he loves each one of us. It is important to reciprocate this love by giving him time in prayer each day. No matter how busy the schedule is, make prayer a priority.

10. GIVE GIFTS ALL THROUGH THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

Allow Christmas to be a season of giving. Giving the gift of time and attention will be a more meaningful gift than anything material. Visit the homebound, call an old friend, and let your family know that you are thinking of them.





History Showcase

LIVING HISTORY: Eye Witness Accounts - Part 1

"Remembrance, like a candle, burns brightest at Christmastime" - Charles Dickens

Remembering the rich 20-year history of our church, the following quotes of early parishioners capture the essence and spirit of this sacred space.

"When we joined the parish in 2004, it was Blessed Pope John XXIII. We attended Mass in the gym of Noonan Academy with fewer than 400 registered parishioners. *Fr. Charles Sullivan was pastor.*

Today we attend Mass in a beautiful church seating up to 1350, have over 3600 registered families and are still growing. *Father Bob Tabbert is our pastor*.

The Women's Guild first fashion show was held in rental space at Daniels Center. Finger sandwiches were made by members. The cost was \$5.00. In 2022 the Fashion Show will be held in our beautiful Parish Life Center, equipped with a full catering kitchen, with seating capacity of 350.

We enjoyed the early days at Noonan Academy where everyone knew each other. Today, even with our growing numbers, we still enjoy the feeling of 'belonging' because of involvement in the ministries available. It's a great parish."- **Stella and Jim McCaffrey**

"Serving as some of the first Eucharist Ministers, we knew it was going to be loving parish. People would automatically set up chairs before Mass and pick them up after Mass at Noonan Academy. No asking, they just did it. Father Sullivan had a great sense of humor and made us all feel at home. It became a custom to introduce oneself to any one near them. We did become a family." - Cora Davies, age 93, speaking for herself and her late husband Don.

"I remember Father Sullivan would say, 'We have all the money we need, but it's still in your pockets.' It's amazing how the parish blossomed and has grown so big with so many young families. As the first music director I am so proud of the wonderful musicians who have served in this position such as the *late Tom Tiehel* and our *current director Richard Owen*. "In my 12 years as director, I never missed a service even though I drove in from Punta Gorda. My Guardian Angel kept me safe."- *Barb Mendillo*

"Moving from a gym and building a new church is a long process. Everyone was so excited. It is a big thing having our own Church. I grew up in one parish in Pennsylvania and have belonged to only one parish here in Florida because I liked it so much. Our Church is out of this world. Father Bob is a great pastor who does a great job."- Bernie Altmann

The remembrances of these early parishioners all echo the hymn, "Surely the presence of Our Lord is in this place."

COVID-19, INFLUENZA AND RSV

Multiple respiratory viruses are currently circulating in the United States, including Covid-19, Influenza and Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV).

HOW DO WESTAY SAFE AND HEALTHY?

Try to follow a healthy diet and exercise plan, stay out of crowds, and use national guidelines for vaccination.

The CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older get a flu vaccine to help protect against flu and its potentially severe complications. Influenza vaccination is a critical tool to prevent potential severe complications.

In terms of influenza vaccine and COVID-19 vaccines given together, CDC guidance states that routine administration of all age-appropriate doses of vaccines simultaneously is recommended for children, adolescents and adults, and are safe for most people. As always, your physician or medical provider is the best resource to address your vaccination needs.

Pediatric hospitals across the country are experiencing a rise in the number of patients admitted with RSV. Infections due to RSV have shown a sharp increase and are appearing earlier than usual this year. Because RSV and influenza are both respiratory viruses that usually circulate during the winter and generally affect younger children and older adults with increased severity, it is important to see your physician for treatment if you or your child is ill.

Most RSV infections go away on their own in a week or two, and there is no specific treatment for RSV. Healthy adults and infants infected with RSV do not usually need to be hospitalized. But some people with RSV infection, especially older adults and infants younger than 6 months of age, may need to be hospitalized if they are having trouble breathing or are dehydrated.

- December 25 was originally a pagan celebration. Nobody knows when Jesus of Nazareth was born and nobody celebrated his birthday for hundreds of years. December 25 was co-opted from the pagan rites connected with the winter solstice.
- The nativity story resulted in several wars. In the first few centuries of the Christian era, controversy over whether or not Jesus was divine at birth created political and social unrest that frequently burst out into full-scale warfare.
- Mistletoe kissing originated with fertility rites. The hanging sprig is a very ancient symbol of virility and therefore anybody standing beneath it is signaling that he or she is available.
- Santa Claus originated in a newspaper ad. Far from being a quaint medieval legend, Santa Claus first appeared as a recognizable entity was in a newspaper ad for toys and "gift books" in the mid 19th century.
- Christmas is only recently a "family" holiday. It was originally celebrated as an adult form of "trick or treat," but with the "treat" consisting of booze and the threatened "trick" consisting of bodily harm or destruction of property!
- The Christmas Tree is a manufactured tradition. Victorian intellectuals invented the tradition as part of a social movement to consciously reform Christmas away from its tradition of harsh and loud drinking.
- "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" was originally a threat. The ever-popular song was originally sung, loudly and repeatedly, by crowds of rowdy, lower-class servants demanding booze from their masters... or else. (i.e. "We won't go until we get some!")




