"I am the Way and Truth and the Life."

Lent's forty days of prayer and fasting offer a process of healing and liberation. In Lent we place ourselves nearer to the suffering servant, Jesus Christ. We ponder the Redeemer's suffering. We remember that Christ's Passion sanctified all human suffering. We relate to His pain because we are touched by the corporate weight of sin and evil in the world. It rubs against us in ordinary life. The Christian is called to push back the tsunami of sin and evil.

Demons are liars and not to be listened to but as Fr. Bamonte, a Rome exorcist, teaches, there are times when, in the midst of the rite of exorcism, a demon is forced by God to say something absolutely true to glorify the Father and torment the demon.

We were praying the rosary silently as the mandated priest began to pray from the "Rite". Suddenly a guttural voice burst forth from the tormented person, "I hate Lent! We hate Lent! You believers do what you're supposed to do! Hate!"

Why does Lent pose a real threat to the kingdom of darkness? It's focus is on prayer, penance and almsgiving. This foundational tripod has the intentional purpose of formation for Love. We attempt to reorder our lives to the Gospel.

Through His suffering, Christ enters into our hearts anew; into that part of us that longs for encounter and healing.



On the Cross, divine love is revealed. His Passion, the bridge to Easter, tenderizes our heart; challenges our mind. The Paschal mystery is a unique love story; it's our story. It's personal. Christ saw you and me from the Cross. With our sin we echo, "Crucify Him".

Christ freely gives his life to save us. The demons hate Lent because the faithful remember our dignity in light of His passion. We recall the price He paid to heal and liberate us. Calvary is a matter of life and death. Through His wounds we receive healing as understood in scripture, "He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed (1 Peter 2:24)."

The following are 7 keys to healing liberation:

AWARENESS

"Stay awake, alert", scripture tells us. Lent invites us to keen awareness of God's abiding presence. We examine our consciousness, and conscience to repent and gain freedom to know, love and serve God. We are always aware of what or who we love. Once I heard a priest retreat master challenge the audience of clergy, "Fathers, if you are not aware of the angelic presence that is filling this room presently, then your spiritual antenna is not tuned in."

Healing/Liberation CONTINUED

ACCOUNTABILITY

During Lent the Church intentionally increases opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession is one of two sacraments categorized as "healing". Accountability to a confessor is healthy for the soul, offering relief from shame and guilt, releasing the weight of sin-sickness. Confession is a healing encounter with Christ who quickly embraces us with His tender mercies.

REVELATION

The Paschal mystery is the revelation of Trinitarian love. Inexhaustible is the contemplation of the Father's revelation in His Son Jesus. During Lent we can grow deeper in love with God and more able to imitate Christ's life.

REPARATION

Lent is a time to offer reparation for the sins of the world. In Roman Catholic tradition, an act of reparation is a prayer or devotion with the intent to expiate the "sins of others", e.g. for the repair of the sin of blasphemy, or the sufferings of Jesus Christ. The opportunity to offer reparation on behalf of the sins of others is a powerful act of mercy. If I can offer to God my act of reparation for the sins of any family (mine included), it is a privilege to do so. If you have loved ones living who left the Church (who doesn't?), you can offer reparation to the heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart never ceases to be pierced by our sin. The evil spirits will tempt and discourage you away from offering reparation. Resist and they will flee.

SIMPLICITY

Lenten practices encourage us to simplify our lives. Most of us strive for increased austerity during the 40 days of penitential practice. Prayer simplifies the heart. Fasting purifies the soul. Almsgiving magnifies the Lord. Interior and exterior simplicity exemplifies purity of heart. To be content with less is to make more room for God. We can ponder Mother Mary's simplicity to see it's genius and beauty. Even during her Son's Passion, Mary models the simplicity of desiring only God's will. Anyone who's read the C.S. Lewis classic, The Screwtape Letters (a good lesson on spiritual warfare), learns how the evil spirits try to complicate our lives to distract us away from God.

OBEDIENCE

Obedience is a willed response to faith in God. We obey because we believe and love our Creator. One third of the angels were cast out of Heaven because they decided to disobey, and rebel against God's will. During exorcisms, we witness how very legalistic the demons are. Obedience is a protective armor. Scripture reveals that God loves obedience. Obedience of faith is sometimes difficult but grace makes it very possible.

<u>HUMILITY</u>

Humility is truth; the moral virtue that prevents a person from reaching beyond himself. Pride does the opposite. Adam and Eve demonstrate pride through their disobedience in the Garden. Humility restrains the unruly desire for selfish greatness and lead us to true esteem with respect to God and others. Religious humility recognizes one's total dependence on God. Moral humility recognizes one's creaturely equality with others. Humility is not only the opposite of pride. It's opposed to immoderate self-abjection, which fails to recognize God's gifts and use them according to his will. Humility in Latin means humus, or ground.

Lent affords a special opportunity to consider Christ's humility and imitate it. Pride can hide in corners of our heart. On Ash Wednesday the Church reminds us, "You are dust", but we need to be aware that it is in His Blood that has sanctified, saved and healed the dust that we are.

How does Lent lead to healing? Accompanying Christ into the tomb, we arise with Him on Easter, a new creation.



The following information reminds the faithful of the regulations for fast and abstinence during the Lent and Easter season:

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent (and Good Friday) are the days of abstinence.

NOTE: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

FASTING, ALMSGIVING AND PRAYER are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.



With St. Patrick's Day falling on a Friday (March 17) during the Lenten Season, Bishop Frank J. Dewane is granting a one-day dispensation of abstaining from meat on that Friday alone. The Faithful are encouraged to choose another day in the same week to abstain from meat and to perform some other penance or work of charity on March 17 to assist in their spiritual Lenten journey. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age or older. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent (including Good Friday) are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.





MESSAGE FROM Father Bob


My Dear Parishioners,

Fr. Bob began his life in Illinois as one of four children of devoutly Catholic parents, Bernadette and Robert Tabbert. "I have two older sisters and a younger brother. My earliest memories recall my parent's active involvement in the church. We attended Mass every Sunday." As a young boy, Bob Tabbert attended St. Theresa Elementary School. He went onto St. Thomas of Villanova and St. Viator High School in Arlington Heights, Illinois. It was during these influential high school years that Bob began to seriously reflect upon his call to the priesthood. "One of my greatest influences was Maryknoll, a non-profit missionary society that helps the poor and oppressed in Africa, Asia and Latin America." Maryknoll is a family of ministers who through active witness to Jesus Christ, work in partnership with those they serve to be a model of compassion and mercy while promoting a global vision of empowerment, community, justice and peace.

"Maryknoll had a special program in Glen Ellyn, Illinois for juniors and seniors in high school," says Fr. Bob. "I was introduced at that time to the concept of the Third World. Priests would talk to us about the call and I started to believe this path would be right for me."

After high school graduation, Fr. Bob spent time visiting Florida with his parents. "We toured the St. John Vianney College Seminary in Miami and I knew that I wanted to attend. I was accepted in 1971 and began my pastoral application." Becoming a priest isn't simply earning a college degree. It is an eight-year journey that Fr. Bob likens to the courtship experienced between a man and woman dating. "You begin by talking and getting to know one another, which can lead to an engagement and eventually a commitment. The seminary experience is very much like courtship. You get to know each other, find out what you like and what you don't and then you deal with the bumps along the road." For Bob, these years in the seminary were a time of great discernment. "Ultimately, I said "Yes," this is what God is calling me to do."

Upon completion of the two-year training program, Fr. Bob went onto the St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach, Florida.

He studied at their School of Theology for six years culminating with his ordination into the priesthood in 1979. "This was such a wonderful day," recalls Fr. Bob. "I remember celebrating my first Mass at St. Andrew Catholic Church in Cape Coral. It was an incredible moment and remains a highlight for me. I was surrounded by family, priests, relatives and friends. After the eight year seminary experience, it was truly joyful."

During his early years as a priest, Fr. Bob served in parishes along Florida's West Coast. Working full-time as a recruiter, counseling men that expressed an interest in the priesthood, Fr. Bob spent a lot of time on the road. "Eventually, I became the Director of Vocations for the Dioceses of St. Petersburg and Venice. I served at St. Martha's Parish in Sarasota for 3 ½ years and then was reassigned to St. Jude Cathedral," recalls Fr. Bob. "I enjoyed journeying with these men and helping them along the seminary process." He carried on this work until 1983 when the Diocese of Venice became its own entity, apart from the Diocese of St. Petersburg. "When this happened, I continued my recruiting work while in residence at the Cathedral of the Epiphany in Venice." Eventually I was reassigned as an associate pastor at St. Ann's Parish in Naples." Fr. Bob spent three years there and then got the call to lead parishioners at St. Peter the Apostle, also in Naples. "This was another great experience for me, as St. Peter the Apostle is a trilingual cultural parish. It was quite a challenge to blend the Hispanic and Haitian communities, but certainly an enjoyable one." During the five years Fr. Bob spent at St. Peter's, he was actively involved in a capital fund drive for a new church building. "I so enjoyed this campaign," says Fr. Bob. "To begin a grass roots effort which culminates in the creation of beautiful facilities so desperately needed is truly the work of God."

After St. Peter's, the Diocese asked Fr. Bob to return to St. Ann's, this time as Pastor, where he led the Church for 11 years. Through hard work and dedication, Fr. Bob initiated yet another capital fund drive. "We were able to complete a primary and middle school and also build a parish life center, chapel and residence for the clergy."


In May of 2007, Fr. Bob got the call to lead Blessed Pope John XXIII in Ft. Myers, a large and growing community he described as warm and welcoming. "The people of Blessed Pope John XXIII were wonderful – supportive, engaging and actively involved in the many ministries the parish offered. I was impressed with the witness the people of this parish gave to their faith." The call to volunteerism was truly inclusive.

When our patron was canonized a saint, our parish name changed, too. St. John XXIII has continued to grow in leaps and bounds.

Fr. Bob saw that an affordable housing complex become a reality and the Villas were built on location for seniors living with a fixed income. "To have a place where these people who have done so much for our country and our faith now have a decent and respectful place to live and sleep gives me great joy."

While enjoying the time shepherding his flock at St. John XXIII, Fr. Bob embarked on yet another building campaign- the construction and recent completion of the Parish Life Center and Adoration Chapel. The Faith Formation programs and Adult Education meetings now have a functional place to gather. The main hall can host a variety of celebrations and gatherings. The St. Luke Adoration chapel has become a place of personal prayer before the Blessed Sacrament for many parishioners. We could not have done this without the generous contributions and prayers of you, the parishioners.

"These 16 years have passed so quickly. It is my connection with you, my parishioners, and to our God, that will keep the flame alive and well."



GIVING TO THE CFA Through a Qualified Charitable Distribution

In 2020 the law changed, requiring those 72 years old or older to begin taking a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their individual retirement account (IRA). However, only those who will turn 70½ (born on or after July 1, 1949) in 2020 or later may wait until age 72 to begin taking required distributions. 




