

Palm Sunday

THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY OF JESUS

Jesus Christ was on his way to Jerusalem, knowing full well that this trip would end in his sacrificial death for the sin of humanity. He sent two disciples ahead to the village of Bethphage, about a mile away from the city at the foot of the Mount of Olives. He told them to look for a donkey tied by a house, with its unbroken colt next to it.

Jesus instructed the disciples to tell the owners of the animal that "The Lord has need of it." (Luke 19:31, ESV)

The men found the donkey, brought it and its colt to Jesus, and placed their cloaks on the colt. Jesus sat on the young donkey and slowly, humbly, made his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. In his path, people threw their cloaks on the ground and put palm branches on the road before him. Others waved palm branches in the air.

Large Passover crowds surrounded Jesus, shouting "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matthew 21:9, ESV)

By that time the commotion was spreading through the entire city. Many of the Galilean disciples had earlier seen Jesus raise Lazarus from the dead. Undoubtedly they were spreading the news of that astonishing miracle.

The Pharisees, who were jealous of Jesus and afraid of the Romans, said: "Teacher, rebuke your disciples. He answered, I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out." (Luke 19:39-40, ESV)

POINTS OF INTEREST FROM PALM SUNDAY

When he told the disciples to get the donkey, Jesus referred to himself as "The Lord," a definite proclamation of his divinity.


By riding into Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey, Jesus fulfilled an ancient prophecy in Zechariah 9:9: "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." This was the only instance in the four Gospel books in which Jesus rode an animal.

Throwing cloaks in the path of someone was an act of homage and submission. The people were recognizing Jesus as the promised Messiah.

The people's cries of 'Hosanna' came from Psalm 118:25-26. Hosanna means "save now." Despite what Jesus had foretold about his mission, the people were looking for a military Messiah who would overthrow the Romans and restore Israel's independence.

QUESTION FOR REFLECTION

The crowds refused to see Jesus Christ as he truly was, placing their personal desires on him instead. Who is Jesus for you? Is he someone whom you want to satisfy your selfish wants and goals, or is he Lord and Master who gave up his life to save you from your sins?

Holy Land COLLECTION




Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday, in the Christian tradition, the first day of Holy Week and the Sunday before Easter, commemorating Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It is associated in many churches with the blessing and procession of palms (leaves of the date palm or twigs from locally available trees).

These special ceremonies were taking place toward the end of the 4th century in Jerusalem and are described in the travelogue Peregrinatio Etheriae (The Pilgrimage of Etheria). In the West the earliest evidence of the ceremonies is found in the Bobbio Sacramentary (8th century). During the Middle Ages the ceremony for the blessing of the palms was elaborate: the procession began in one church, went to a church in which the palms were blessed, and returned to the church in which the procession had originated for the singing of the liturgy. The principal feature of the liturgy that followed the procession was the chanting by three deacons of the account of the Passion of Christ (Matthew 26:36-27:54). Musical settings for the crowd parts were sometimes sung by the choir. After reforms of the Roman Catholic liturgies in 1955 and 1969, the ceremonies were somewhat simplified in order to emphasize the suffering and death of Christ.

The day is now called officially Passion Sunday. The liturgy begins with a blessing and procession of palms, but prime attention is given to a lengthy reading of the Passion, with parts taken by the priest, lectors, and congregation. The palms are often taken home by the members of the congregation to serve as sacramentals (sacred signs of the sacraments), and some of them are burned the following year to serve as the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION:

BAPTISM: Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered for registered members of St. John XXIII and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact the office at **(239) 561-2245** for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. Please contact Frannie at 239-561-7499 for more information or to begin the process. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, please contact Frannie at 239-561-7499 to begin the process.





THE GLORY OF THE CROSS

Reverencing the cross on Good Friday always stirs my heart as I watch our community honor by some gesture or touch, the cross - symbol of our Savior's love for us. Whether we come forward feeling stressed, depressed or grateful, we walk up to that cross knowing earth life is full of our own or others' failure. The cross shouts that reality. Triduum tells our salvation story-we no longer have to feel painful shame; guilt can be a pathway to growth. Shame is the feeling of being fundamentally flawed and unworthy of love, belonging and connection. It thrives in secret negative self-judgement and fuels addictions. Shame doesn't lead to positive change. Guilt occurs when we assess that our behavior does not match our values and it can drive positive change. Political and religious leaders were convinced that a humiliating crucifixion would be the end of the prophet who stirred up the people with proofs of their worth (teachings, miracles). Jesus had no shame or guilt, but he carried ours to the cross freeing us from this double emotional burden. He gave us a Way, a spiritual GPS to navigate our inevitable failures. "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (Jn 16:32-33) Research has shown that having a spiritual practice is protective of our mental health. And I get how that works, especially on Good Friday. Resurrection joy is our alleluia of thanks for the all-embracing presence of Love.



In order to be happy and fulfilled, we must help, love and care for others. On March 4, our Journey to Hope team was one of 87 teams that raised \$104,440 to support NAMI's advocacy, support groups and free education for local individuals living with a mental illness and their families. We thank contributors for helping us be the fourth team in terms of funds raised (\$3,520). Be blessed a hundredfold.

Divine Mercy Sunday

Join us for a very special celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday following Easter, on April 16. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Veneration of the image of the Divine Mercy and confessions will be heard starting at 1:30pm in the Parish Life Center classrooms.

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA:

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday, April 7. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:


"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will be My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

TO COMPLETE THE NOVENA:

EVERY DAY AT 3 RECITE THE DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET:

- April 7 First Day: Good Friday, April 7: Bring to Me All Mankind, especially all sinners
- April 8: Bring to me the Souls of Priests and Religious.
- April 9: Bring to me all devout and faithful souls.
- April 10: Bring to me those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know me
- April 11: Bring to me the souls of those who have separated themselves from my church.
- April 12: Bring to me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children.
- April 13: Bring to me the souls who especially venerate and glorify my mercy.
- April 14: Bring to me the souls who are detained in purgatory.
- April 15: Bring to me souls who have become lukewarm.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY PLENARY INDULGENCE: In a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!").



Our Holy Fathers have told us that Divine Mercy is the greatest attribute of God, and it is especially needed in our modern, secular times. All are invited to attend our Divine Mercy Service to receive these powerful graces and blessings of Mercy.



To fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy, we should:

- 1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter
- 2. Sincerely repent of all our sins
- 3. Place our complete trust in Jesus
- 4. Confess your sins to Jesus before that Sunday
- 5. Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast
- 6. Venerate* the Image of The Divine Mercy
- Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

*To venerate a sacred image or statue simply means to perform some act or make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents in this case, our Most Merciful Savior.




