


Christ welcomes all

# 9. BLESSED POPE JOHN XXIII - STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

Dove of Peace/ Holy Spirit



The Dove of Peace (or Holy Spirit) Stained Glass Window is above the Altar. There are over 20 Stained Glass Windows in the Church. Some of the windows measure over 27 feet wide and 5 feet high. The windows were installed by Casola of Fort Myers, Florida.



# **Abraham welcomes Angels**

This window is the first as you enter from the left side in the back of the sacristy. Abraham's welcome and generosity to the strangers (angels) is in keeping with our parish Credo.



Christ the good shepherd

The good shepherd (Christ) knows his sheep and this sheep (our parishioners) know him. Believe in Christ and He will look after you.



**Sermon on the Mount** 

Christ gave us the Beatitudes as a guide to how we should live together in harmony. This window, and its message, is one of the larger ones in the sanctuary.



**Good Samaritan** 

Like the good Samaritan, we are asked to treat strangers as family and care for them as part of our spiritual life.

Jesus in the Dessert

Prayer is the way to inner piece. Even Christ took the time for deep thoughtful prayer.



**Entering Jerusalem** 

The joyful entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday represents our joy about Christ's ministry. This is the high point of His ministry before the Passion. Life is full of highs and lows and faith can help bridge between them.



**Last Supper** 

This very large window displays the establishment of the Eucharist with the 12 apostles. Note that only one apostle does not have an aura halo.



Mary Magdalene at the tomb

This represents the end of the grief of Christ's crucifixion. The message of the angel at the empty tomb is both inspiring and mysterious.



Resurrection

The core of our faith is in the resurrection of Christ. The Devine Christ has overcome death for us and opened Paradise to believers.

Looking from the North end of the church property, the office is on the left and the entrance to the Chapel on the right. The Cross Tower is 100 feet high and can be seen for miles. Grading of the property started March 25, 2004 and the frame work of the roofing started 102 days later on July 2, 2004. The end beams on each side of the Sanctuary are 90 feet long and the two center beams are 105 feet long.




There are three shrines in the chapel, one in the front right and one in each corner in the back.
