# CONQUER Fear with the Lord as Your Light and Salvation

It's said that when we have a problem, we can choose to have either fear or faith. Fear usually puts the focus on us - our situation, and what we can do to affect the outcome. Conversely, faith sets our mind on God's authority, His control of our lives, and acknowledges His goodness.

It's clear by Psalm 27's powerful message which path David has chosen to follow. His trust in the Lord is evident from the opening declaration in verse 1, and carries all the way through to a calm direction in the final phrase, "...be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord."

#### What Does "the Lord Is My Light and My Salvation" Mean?

David's use of the word "light" here shares a long tradition of Scripture authors before and after him. He may have heard some of these passages as a boy. The Lord may have revealed this picture of Himself as light into David's spirit while he tended sheep in the fields. However it came to him, the thought brought David both peace and joy.

In this context, David is proclaiming that God is with him even in the midst of trouble. This is a common theme in his writings, because of so many times David had seen this truth already. From facing a lion in the wilderness to confronting the giant Goliath, David had experienced God's presence and deliverance.

#### **God Is Our Shield Against Fear**

Imagine being a soldier in David's day, getting ready to go out into battle. You would take great care to equip yourself with defensive armor, from the helmet on down, to be protected from the enemy's attacks. The final piece you'd need would be a shield to wear or hold in front of you for an extra layer of protection.

In his songs, David compared putting on a strong shield before battle with asking God to go with us as we face struggles in life. He wasn't the first Scripture writer to do that, either. Moses recorded God's words in a vision Abram had, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield..." (Genesis 15:1). Moses himself used the phrase as he spoke blessings over the tribes of Israel: "He is your shield and helper and your glorious sword" (Deuteronomy 33:29).

This picture of God reveals a challenging truth, namely that God is more interested in growing our character than giving us perfect lives. So, He often lets us go through difficult times, using situations and issues to mature us. But, as we walk into our battle, however big or small, God promises to cover us. He protects our hearts and minds from attacks that the enemy (that is, Satan) launches, while strengthening us to stand firm.


### Sacrament PREPARATION

**BAPTISM:** Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered after the preparation process is completed by the parents and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact Frannie at 239-561-2245 for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. For more information or to begin the process, please contact Frannie at 239-561-7499. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

**CONFIRMATION PREPARATION:** Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, contact Kelly Evers at **239-561-3022** to begin the process.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Congratulations on your decision to enter the beautiful sacrament of marriage! The heart of Marriage Preparation in the Catholic Church is the realization that "your wedding is one day but your marriage lasts a lifetime." Couples wishing to be married will need to contact us at least six months prior to the desired date. A venue should not be booked prior to first meeting with a priest and getting a confirmation from the parish office. The engaged couple will complete the Witness to Love program alongside a mentor couple, fill out the required forms, provide updated Baptismal Certificate(s) and attend a Diocesan retreat. 

#### **AVOID FALLS**

# "FALLING IS NOT A NORMAL PART OF AGING"

Falling can be prevented by addressing the risk factors in our homes and living areas. The Fire Department recently provided a presentation at St. John XXIII Catholic Church and the information is critical in keeping you healthy. They describe their goal as preventing you from having "One Bad Day" (a fall!). The acronym "AVOID FALLS" can help you to minimize some of those risk factors.

A = Awareness of Risk Factors

**V** = Vision (have it checked)

O = Other medical problems

= Imbalance (balance training is very helpful to prevent falls, and falls prevent fractures!)

**D** = Drug interactions (address your medications and over the counter medicines with your doctor)

**F** = Faulty Footware (closed toe sneakers and sturdy shoes are best)

A = Assistive Devices

L = Living space environment is free of trip

L = Level of activity is appropriate for your abilities

**S** = Step Wise Lee (a program to help prevent falls in Lee County)

BE SAFE, and if you have any of these risk factors, discuss them with your doctor.

For falls prevention resources, call the elder helpline at **800 963-5337** or call **911** for ALL medical emergencies. If you do fall and only need help getting back up, you can say "Lift Assist Only" if you call EMS/911. But it's much better to prevent that fall in the first place!

# Did You Know?

Rainy season, dry season, no matter the season, it is always wise to conserve water.

While 70 percent of the Earth is water, only 2.5 percent of that is fresh water. Polar ice, glaciers hold two thirds of that fresh water.

Irrigation systems should be timed to run early morning. Running sprinklers systems in mid day result in considerable evaporation due to sunshine, lower relative humidity and wind.

Running the tap water while brushing your teeth or shaving can result in over two gallons of water running down the drain.

While waiting for shower water to warm you can capture the water in a bucket and use to water flowers.

Think how efficiently you would use water if you had to walk a distance to a well and back home again! Water is indeed a precious resource.

### FLORIDA BISHOPS OPPOSE **Extreme Abortion Amendment** Vote No on Amendment 4



TO DEFEAT **AMENDMENT 4:** 

Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes fullterm abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. We urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of lateterm abortion and oppose the abortion amendment. In doing so, we will not only protect the weakest, most innocent, and defenseless of human life among us but also countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion.

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision of society. Direct attacks on innocent persons are never morally acceptable, at any stage or in any condition. In our state, human life is repeatedlybeing destroyed by abortion. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.

This matter concerning the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state. The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent public policy priority. Therefore, we support a coordinated campaign to mobilize against the proposed amendment.


Come to the second floor of the Library to view the life size replica of the Shroud of Turin and view the blood of atonement on the Shroud of Jesus.
