MESSAGE FROM

The St. John XXIII Administrator

Dear Friends,

This weekend, the readings tell us that God is a 'God of life' and not of death (Reading 1 and the Gospel.) He provides life through humility and equality (Reading 2). In the Gospel, we have an interesting report of two stories that happened, one with a 12-year-old girl and another with a woman who had been suffering hemorrhages for 12 years.

These girls had many afflictions. 1.) Being a girl/woman; 2.) Being sick girls; and 3.) Women with flow of blood. As per the law, they are considered impure subjects. When they publicly touch others, they could very well be stoned to death as punishment for polluting others. But Jesus gives graceful, gentle, and kind words of healing and touches them. With His healing words and touch, He not only healed the girls but also the crowds with the truth that He is the God of life. Let us remember Jesus' kind words, "Talitha Koum". There are so many in the world today who are being discriminated against or abused for being girls, children or older in age. For anyone in vulnerable situations, let us bring the words of Jesus, "Talitha Koum."

As we celebrate Independence Day, our nation's most patriotic holiday, on July 4th, let us remember to remind the people of our country that our God is a God of life. Leading to a culture of death is not American and excludes the right of freedom, as well.

This past week, we were thrilled having the children attend VBS (Vacation Bible School.) They certainly had a lot of fun! Thank you for sending your children and supporting their journey. The Religious Education Team and Youth Ministry provided many creative efforts, and we thank them!

Fr. Simon Dao, our Parochial Vicar will be going back to his religious congregation on July 12th after serving the last 4 years at St. John XXIII. Soon, another Vietnamese priest from his congregation will be appointed by our Bishop. Therefore, next weekend, July 6th and 7th after each Mass, there will be a small reception planned for him in the Parish Life Center. Please grace him with your blessings and gratitude for his service to our community.



GIVING TO THE CFA Through a Qualified Charitable Distribution

In 2020 the law changed, requiring those 72 years old or older to begin taking a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their individual retirement account (IRA). However, only those who will turn 70½ (born on or after July 1, 1949) in 2020 or later may wait until age 72 to begin taking required distributions. If you are currently receiving RMDs (or should be) because you are over age 70½, you must continue taking these RMDs.

FOR TRADITIONAL ACCOUNTS THIS INCOME IS TAXABLE!

To avoid paying taxes on this income while also meeting the obligation of the RMD, you may designate the distribution as a gift directly from the IRA custodian to the CFA. You can donate up to \$100,000 and married couples can donate up to \$200,000 if the spouse has a separate IRA.

DOUBLE YOUR GIFT

Matching gifts are a type of corporate philanthropy that allows donors giving smaller donations the opportunity to maximize the impact of their donation on an organization.



In a matching gifts program, a company donates to a nonprofit organization in response to one of their employees giving a gift.

These gifts can range in maximum sizes and ratio, but many companies will match an employee's donation at a 1:1 ration, starting at \$25. Retirees and/ or spouses may also qualify.

PARISH LIFE CENTER GUIDELINES Treat Our PLC with TLC

REGISTRATION:

• Submit a registration form and have it approved by authorized staff to reserve a requested space and be added to the parish calendar.

SAFETY:

- Take care of yourself and be respectful of others. Document and report all accidents or injuries to a parish staff member.
- At least one authorized, trained kitchen user must be present. You must be at least 15 years old to be in the kitchen, unless special permission has been granted by authorized staff.
- All spills or trip hazards are to be contained and corrected. Report maintenance or repair needs.
- The stages are reserved for speakers, performers, and authorized personnel. Always keep children safe and off the stage.

CLASSROOMS:

- When having a meeting in one of the flex rooms, please DO NOT move any of the panels/walls. Those are to be moved by trained staff for security purposes. If you need a smaller room than what is provided please advise when requesting the room for your meeting. Also if any tables or chairs are moved please return everything back to where it goes.
- Classrooms are food-free zones. No food or drinks are allowed in the five stand-alone classrooms.

UPKEEP:

- Keep walls, windows, and doors free of decorations. Free-standing banners, easels, and portable walls are available for approved requests.
- Table decorations are allowed, including weighted balloons. All decorations must be removed during event clean-up.
- Only floor cord protectors, not tape, are to be used for extension cords.
- Refrain from placing feet on walls.

CLEAN UP:

- Return the PLC to pristine condition after your event. All trash must be removed.
- Tables/chairs must be returned to original placement.
- Do not leave extra items without staff approval.

TECHNOLOGY:

- Air conditioning and heating will be controlled only by authorized staff.
- Audio/visual equipment is to be operated by authorized and properly trained personnel.

- Only John Hancock actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. All the others signed later.
- The White House held its first 4th of July party in 1801.
- Congress made Independence Day an official unpaid holiday for federal employees in 1870. In 1938, Congress changed Independence Day to a paid federal holiday.
- The stars on the original American flag were in a circle so all the Colonies would appear equal.
- Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird but was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who recommended the bald eagle.
- Every 4th of July the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not actually rung) 13 times in honor of the original 13 colonies.
- Approximately 150 million hot dogs and 700 million pounds of chicken are consumed on this day.
- In 2012, vast majority of imported U.S. flags (\$3.6 million) were made in China.
- Fireworks are a tradition of celebrating our national holiday. The U.S. imported \$227.3 million worth of fireworks from China in 2012. U.S. exports of fireworks, by comparison, came to just \$11.7 million in 2012, with Israel purchasing more than any other country (\$2.5 million)
- In 1776, there were 2.5 million people living in the new nation. Today the population of the U.S.A. is 316 million

FLORIDA BISHOPS OPPOSE Extreme Abortion Amendment Vote No on Amendment 4



Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes fullterm abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws limiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion.* These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment.

We urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of lateterm abortion and oppose the abortion amendment. In doing so, we will not only protect the weakest, most innocent, and defenseless of human life among us but also countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion.

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision of society. Direct attacks on innocent persons are never morally acceptable, at any stage or in any condition. In our state, human life is repeatedlybeing destroyed by abortion. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.

This matter concerning the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state. The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent public policy priority. Therefore, we support a coordinated campaign to mobilize against the proposed amendment.
