Dear Friends,

In continuation of last week's gospel, Jesus sending his disciples two by two, this week Jesus holds a reporting session with them. On hearing the jubilant reports on their works, He tells the disciples "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while".

Let us focus on what could be our 'deserted place'. We all like a place of our own; a place where we love to spend our day off and rejuvenate after a hard day at work. For some, that deserted place could be a bar with good ambience; company of friends, tv, internet or social media; or it could be a place simply spending time with children and family!

Have we ever considered that we all have a place to reflect? Our Adoration Chapel may look mostly deserted or have a few people attending but it is a place where Jesus leads us to calm ourselves and rest for a while. When I was in the seminary, we had the 'Examination of Conscience' every night (based on Ignatian spirituality) during the night prayer, which I still do in a shorter form every day.

Michael Faraday is an English Scientist who was the pioneer in the electromagnetic current. He had to address a convocation of scientists in London on the nature of magnets, where the Prince of Wales and later King Edward VII, was also attending. Soon after his spellbound deliverance of his lecture, everyone applauded, giving him a standing ovation. But Michael paid no attention to this as he immediately rushed out of the hall despite the presence of the Prince of Wales. The reason for him leaving so abruptly was that he was on his way to a little church where he was a member to attend the midweek prayer service! That was his deserted place rather than to be amongst the most powerful men of society!

A good Shepherd is the one who spends his time with God and his sheep. We are all called, not simply to be the leader of the family or community but to be the shepherds of our families or community. Let us seek our deserted place. That place can be in the Blessed Sacrament. Let us bring that Eucharistic revival into our family!



THE Sacraments

BAPTISM: Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered after the preparation process is completed by the parents and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact **Frannie** at **239-561-2245** for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. For more information or to begin the process, please contact Frannie at 239-561-7499. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, contact Kelly Evers at 239-561-3022 to begin the process.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Congratulations on your decision to enter the beautiful sacrament of marriage! The heart of Marriage Preparation in the Catholic Church is the realization that "your wedding is one day but your marriage lasts a lifetime." Couples wishing to be married will need to contact us at least six months prior to the desired date. A venue should not be booked prior to first meeting with a priest and getting a confirmation from the parish office. The engaged couple will complete the Witness to Love program alongside a mentor couple, fill out the required forms, provide updated Baptismal Certificate(s) and attend a Diocesan retreat. We are glad you are sending your children to Catholic Schools, and we want to support you in your efforts. Financially, it is a sacrifice for many families. The schools offer a discount for members that are regularly attending Mass.

Each year Bishop Verot High School gives families a form and asks that the Pastor of the parish you attend sign to say that you are using your envelopes and attending Mass each week. This is a school form not a parish form. Please use your envelopes each week. St. Francis Xavier gives a list of all families that applied to their school and mark St. John XXIII as their parish. We check to see if envelopes are used on a regular basis and send this back to the school.

Fr. Jay is not concerned if there is money in the envelope, as much as the fact you are regularly attending Mass with your children. The only way Fr. Jay can know you are coming each week is by the envelope use. This is stated on the form from the school. Many of you give online, which is great, but you still need to put your envelope into the basket each week if you are applying for the discount.



Facing Loss - By Bill Cushnie

When someone we love dies, it is inevitable that questions of faith and spirituality arise. For some, faith is challenged, for some it is dashed, for some it is a comfort, and for some it is a new exploration.

Allow for the search for meaning within the grieving individual's religious or spiritual values. Listen without judgment or advice. If they are angry with God, or confused, simply acknowledge by saying, "It's hard to believe at a time like this." Each individual will work through this search in there own way, and in their own time.

Each individual grieves differently. Additionally, individuals grieve different losses differently. Be flexible, and gentle with yourself and others, and allow the grief and mourning to unfold naturally.

Remember that for the young child, play is the focus of their world. Play is spiritually uplifting for a child. Children grieve in spurts, and may move quickly from sadness to play, and back again. By playing during somber times, they are not intending to be disrespectful, nor should we assume they are 'OK,' and not grieving. Play helps children cope and heal. Join them if you are up to it, and always make it OK for them.

Seek the help of a grief counselor if your or your child's spiritual struggle doesn't soften. Support groups where others are experiencing some of the same struggles are often very helpful.




Include children in the rituals that surround death–funerals, memorial services, burials. They should never be forced, but included as appropriate to age. The very young may just attend with a loving adult. The adolescent may read a poem or speak. Excluding a child from these rituals does not protect them. Including them helps start their healing journey.

Create new rituals that touch the spiritual side. Anything from lighting candles, to releasing balloons with notes, to quiet time at a grave side visit, to reminiscing with family and friends, to laying a flower on an altar. Rituals affirm landmarks in our lives – birthdays, anniversaries, weddings, baptisms, etc. The loss of someone we love is also a landmark in our lives and deserves the attention rituals give.

Faith and/or spirituality are a part of life and contribute to our mental health and ability to survive hardship. However spirituality takes form in your beliefs, embrace it for yourself, and nurture it in others, as they seek peace and comfort at such critical times in life.

Treat Our PLC with TLC

REGISTRATION:

 Submit a registration form and have it approved by authorized staff to reserve a requested space and be added to the parish calendar.

SAFETY:

- Take care of yourself and be respectful of others.
 Document and report all accidents or injuries to a parish staff member.
- At least one authorized, trained kitchen user must be present. You must be at least 15 years old to be in the kitchen, unless special permission has been granted by authorized staff.
- All spills or trip hazards are to be contained and corrected. Report maintenance or repair needs.
- The stages are reserved for speakers, performers, and authorized personnel. Always keep children safe and off the stage.

CLASSROOMS:

- When having a meeting in one of the flex rooms, please DO NOT move any of the panels/walls. Those are to be moved by trained staff for security purposes. If you need a smaller room than what is provided please advise when requesting the room for your meeting. Also if any tables or chairs are moved please return everything back to where it goes.
- Classrooms are food-free zones. No food or drinks are allowed in the five stand-alone classrooms.

UPKEEP:

- Keep walls, windows, and doors free of decorations.
 Free-standing banners, easels, and portable walls are available for approved requests.
- Table decorations are allowed, including weighted balloons. All decorations must be removed during event clean-up.


Come to the second floor of the Library to view the life size replica of the Shroud of Turin and view the blood of atonement on the Shroud of Jesus.


