

MESSAGE FROM

The St. John XXIII Pastor

Fr. Jay



Dear Friends,

Last week, we reflected on how emptying oneself would bring real wealth through the example of the parable of the foolish rich man. This week, the theme expands to reflect deeper on the real wealth, called 'Faith'.

All three readings directly talk about faith:

- The first reading reminds us how faith in God saved the people of Israel in one accord from their enemies.
- 2. The second reading explains the faith of Abraham that brought life in abundance with a better homeland, a heavenly one.
- In the gospel, Jesus tells another parable about a faithful steward. He raises the level of expectation saying, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more".

Faith is not only a subjective trust of God but also calls for an objective and deeper *expression of our trust in the Lord*. Such an expression involves embracing everyone in one accord. Our true faith can never lead to self-righteousness, but to love everyone with inclusiveness. Reaching out to the wounded and bringing healing to them is the outward sign and expression of our faith.

I appreciate all of you being involved in the various ministries at our parish. This is an expression of your faith. Last month at our Parish Advisory Council meeting, we consolidated the mission, goals, objectives and needs of 46 active ministries. The heads of these ministries, along with their teams, clarified what they do, who they serve and how they effectively provide for our parishioners. I am personally so impressed to see an effective and dedicated team of stewards from our parish. Please reflect personally on how the Lord could touch you to be the best steward to your own family, and to the parish family both directly and indirectly.

I became quite emotional while watching the Iranian short film, "The father, daughter and shopkeeper" on YouTube. The financially broken father goes to a convenience store with his daughter. He looks furtively around to see if anyone sees him, picks up a loaf of bread and tries to sneak away. The shopkeeper stops him. The daughter, without knowing what's going on, looks at her father. The shopkeeper says to her 'your father forgot the change' and stashed some money into his hands. The father was already brimming with tears in his eyes. Another customer handed him a bag of rice and told him, 'Sir...you are also forgetting to pick up your rice bag'. The following lines appear on the screen: Every thief is not a thief. Some could be poor and needy. We should help them in such a way that they are not humiliated (especially in front of relatives and children)...

I was reminded of the words of Jesus in the gospel today: "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more".

This coming week, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Let us pray to our Blessed Mother to intercede for us so we can get closer to her and experience the nearness of our Lord. The closer we get to Him, the more He reveals Himself as Son of God. Hail Mary - Mother of God pray for us!

History OF THE Assumption

Catholics around the world mark the Feast of the Assumption of Mary, commemorating the end of her earthly life and assumption into Heaven. But while the feast day is a relatively new one, the history of the holiday, and the mystery behind it – has its roots in the earliest centuries of Christian belief. "As her earthly life comes to an end, the Assumption helps us to understand more fully not just her life, but it helps us to always focus our gaze to Eternity," said EWTN Senior Contributor Dr. Matthew Bunson. "We see in Mary the logic of the Assumption as the culmination of Mary's life," he continued. "A Eucharistic requirement for that day is very fitting."

The dogma of the Assumption of Mary – also called the "Dormition of Mary" in the Eastern Churches – has its roots in the early centuries of the Church. The Catholic Church teaches that when Mary ended her earthly life, God assumed her, body and soul into heaven. This belief traces its roots back to the earliest years of the Church. While a site outside of Jerusalem was recognized as the tomb of Mary, the earliest Christians maintained that "no one was there," Bunson said.

According to St. John of Damascus, in the 5th century, at the Council of Chalcedon in 451, Roman Emperor Marcian requested the body of Mary, Mother of God. St. Juvenal, who was Bishop of Jerusalem replied "Mary died in the presence of all the Apostles, but her tomb, when opened upon the request of St. Thomas, was found empty; wherefrom the Apostles concluded that the body was taken up to heaven," the saint recorded.

By the 8th century, around the time of Pope Adrian, the Church began to change its terminology, renaming the feast day of the Memorial of Mary to the Assumption of Mary, Bunson noted.

The belief in the Assumption of Mary was a widely-held tradition, and a frequent meditation in the writings of saints throughout the centuries. However it was not defined officially until the past century. In 1950, Pope Pius XII made an infallible, ex-cathedra statement in the Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus officially defining the dogma of the Assumption.

"By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory," the pope wrote.

Within the decree, which was passed beforehand to dioceses around the world, Pius surveys centuries of Christian thought and the writings of a number of saints on the Assumption of Mary. "We have throughout the history of the Church an almost universal attestation of this," Bunson said of the Christian tradition's testimony to Mary's Assumption.

"We have this thread that runs throughout the whole of the history of the Church in support of the dogma. That's significant because it supports the tradition of the Church, but it also supports a coming to a deeper understanding of the teachings of the Church of how we rely upon the reflections of some of the greatest minds of our Church."

What's also notable about the dogma, he added, is that it "uses the passive tense," emphasizing that Mary did not ascend into heaven on her own power, as Christ did, but was raised into heaven by God's grace.

JOIN THE MISSION MOVEMENT

Mission Mary Movement is a prayer initiative that encourages everyone to become a missionary, or rather, a "MissionMARY", even if you never leave your home. It is very simple. Just PRAY and TELL. You pray for someone, then tell them. The goal is to encourage everyone to pray for each other. It doesn't matter if the person you pray for is Catholic, Christian, or even atheist. It could be a friend, a relative, an acquaintance, or even a foe. This is God's list – not yours.

There are Three Steps:

- 1. IDENTIFY: Make a list of names of people you know. Ask God for guidance on who goes on the list. You may be surprised to find some people you don't particularly care for coming into your mind. Don't fight it. Add them to the list. Once you have your list, put each name on a slip of paper and put it in a hat or use a list randomizer so that you don't know who you are praying for until you draw the name.
- 2. PRAY: Pick a new name each day and pray for that person's intentions. You can say a rosary or some other prayer. Whatever moves you.
- 3. TELL: Contact the person you prayed for and let them know that you prayed for their intentions that day. It is important that you pray for their intentions, not just the person, because it makes the recipient think of what they are asking God for at that moment. It then becomes a conversation between them and God.



HELPING KIDS COPE WITH



Going back to school can be such a stressful time for kids and their families. Starting a new school year can make kids nervous, especially if there will be changes from the previous year, like a new school, new teachers, or new classmates.

When kids feel anxious about going back, it's important to talk with them about the transition. Find a time to talk when your child is relatively calm. (Avoid times like when your child is upset or getting ready for school.)

THINGS YOU CAN SAY:

"Let's think of some ways I can help make going back to school easier for you." Start by suggesting a few simple things, like packing a special snack or walking your child to the classroom on the first few days. But make it clear that staying home from school just because your child wants to isn't an option.

"What do you like about school?" Talk about good memories from previous school years. Highlight these positive moments and use them as a reminder that school can be rewarding and fun.

"Is there anything in particular about this school year that's worrying you?" Is your child anxious about keeping up? Getting along with teachers? Making friends? Getting bullied? These are common fears among kids, especially if they've struggled in school in the past. Talking about your child's specific concerns can help you find specific solutions.

If your child throws a tantrum about going back to school, try to stay calm and avoid

getting angry or upset. This can be really hard to do. But keep in mind that tantrums are an attention-seeking behavior. So do your best to ignore the tantrum, and praise your child when you see calmer behavior. Then ask when would be a good time to talk about why your child was upset. The best way to cope with back to school anxiety is by easing the transition.

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE:

You can project a sense of confidence and understanding. It may seem like a small thing. But when kids know that you know what they're going through, it can make a big difference: "I see that you're anxious about the new school year. But I believe in you and will help you get through it."

Practice morning and evening routines. That includes school wake-up times, bedtimes, and mealtimes.

Plan extra time to get out the door in the morning. This is especially important during the first few days of school. This will gives you extra time to deal with tantrums or other avoidance tactics without your child being late for class. Having extra time can also reduce your stress, which makes you better equipped to help your child.

Get everything in order ahead of time. Gather needed school supplies well before the first day of school, and work on organizing your child's backpack. Get to know the class schedule. You can even go to school together before the first day and find your child's classrooms and (for older kids) locker.



Give your child choices. Letting kids choose what clothes to wear or breakfast to have can provide a sense of control and excitement about school. You can pick out a few options, then let your child choose a favorite

Reach out to others for support. Try to set up a playdate for your child and a classmate before school starts. It's a good opportunity for you, too. Talking to other families about their own back-to-school struggles and successes is a good reminder that you're not alone.

It's very common for kids to worry and feel anxious about going back to school. But it's also possible that other things could be concerning your child.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- Has anything else happened recently that could be contributing to the anxiety? This could include the loss or illness of a family member or a fight with a close friend.
- Is your child getting enough sleep and eating well?
- Does your child get stomachaches before school?
- Does your child have trouble separating from you at other times, like with a babysitter?
- Has your child been throwing tantrums for other reasons?

Talking to your child and taking steps to ease concerns can smooth the transition back to school. But if these strategies don't help and the tantrums continue or get worse, keep an eye on what you're seeing. You can use an anxiety log to take notes. The notes will come in handy if you decide to reach out to someone, like a health care professional, for help.

BLESSING

God of knowledge and wisdom, bless all students young and old, as they begin a new school year.

Help them discover and develop the gifts you have given. As they grow in knowledge, help them to also grow in kindness and compassion, learning respect for themselves and others.

We ask your blessing on parents and all those who care for students. Strengthen them to surround our students with encouragement, support and love.

Remind us that wherever they go, that You are always with them. Fill them with the joy of learning so that they may be better equipped to be your servants.


