

MESSAGE FROM

The St. John XXIII Pastor

Fr. Jay



Dear Friends,

The readings this week may seem a little scary. They talk about fire and division, which unfortunately is often interpreted as punishment to those who do not listen to His word. But there is a deeper meaning in this passage while reading it through scriptural lenses. Jesus, being the Son of God, wanted to break through the complacent minds of his own clan. The Jews believed that being blessed with wealth, riches and having a large family was enough to be called 'the chosen people'. Please read the whole chapter that explains His teachings on being worldly.

I remember a proverb, "he who is on fire cannot sit on a chair". Jesus wanted to break through this Jewish comfort zone. He wanted to ignite the flame and wished it were already blazing. He wanted to bring fire into their hearts with His word.

The power of the Word of God, as explained in Hebrews 4:12, completes its task... 'the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart'.

The fire we receive through baptism is the true faith in Jesus. Without Jesus, everything becomes worldly, and anything worldly ends up divided. The fire of Jesus is like the sharp flame coming out of a fire-gun that welds metals or fire on the furnace to brighten up glittering gold. By use of strong words, Jesus is calling us to get 'glittered in faith' and stick to one another and to renounce anything worldly.

Let us try to see the flame of faith in ourselves and set it as a blazing fire through witnessing our faith.




Sacrament PREPARATION

BAPTISM: Congratulations on your decision to baptize your child! At St. John XXIII, we are happy to help your family prepare for the celebration. Baptisms are offered after the preparation process is completed by the parents and are scheduled only after the preparation process is completed by the parents. Please do not make arrangements for family members until you have actually received a date. Contact Frannie at 239-561-2245 for more information or to begin the process.

FIRST COMMUNION: (also called First Eucharist and First Reconciliation) Children in first grade or above, who have expressed a desire and willingness and are attending Mass, are welcome to begin the two year process of preparing for these Sacraments. The first year consists of regular attendance at Faith Formation classes or through a Diocesan Catholic school. (Either St. Francis Xavier or St. Andrew) The second year continues those classes, but also adds in direct Sacramental Preparation (Reconciliation and Communion) sessions. For more information or to begin the process, please contact Frannie at 239-561-7499. Parents who home school their children must contact the office during Year I.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: Celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation is a two year process that begins at the start of 9th Grade and is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. (Older teens are certainly welcome!). Each year consists of Faith Formation through the parish Youth Group or a Diocesan Catholic school (Bishop Verot) as well as scheduled Confirmation classes and a retreat. Please note: Students from Bishop Verot must register and attend the preparation classes at the beginning of 9th grade. If you are entering the 9th grade or would like more information on our program, contact **Kelly Evers** at **239-561-3022** to begin the process.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Congratulations on your decision to enter the beautiful sacrament of marriage! The heart of Marriage Preparation in the Catholic Church is the realization that "your wedding is one day but your marriage lasts a lifetime." Couples wishing to be married will need to contact us at least six months prior to the desired date. A venue should not be booked prior to first meeting with a priest and getting a confirmation from the parish office. The engaged couple will complete the Witness to Love program alongside a mentor couple, fill out the required forms, provide updated Baptismal Certificate(s) and attend a Diocesan retreat. GIVING TO THE CFA Through a Qualified Charitable Distribution

In 2020 the law changed, requiring those 72 years old or older to begin taking a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their individual retirement account (IRA). However, only those who will turn 70½ (born on or after July 1, 1949) in 2020 or later may wait until age 72 to begin taking required distributions. If you are currently receiving RMDs (or should be) because you are over age 70½, you must continue taking these RMDs.

FOR TRADITIONAL ACCOUNTS THIS INCOME IS TAXABLE!

To avoid paying taxes on this income while also meeting the obligation of the RMD, you may designate the distribution as a gift directly from the IRA custodian to the CFA. You can donate up to \$100,000 and married couples can donate up to \$200,000 if the spouse has a separate IRA.

DOUBLE YOUR GIFT

Matching gifts are a type of corporate philanthropy that allows donors giving smaller donations the opportunity to maximize the impact of their donation on an organization.

These gifts can range in maximum sizes and ratio, but many companies will match an employee's donation at a 1:1 ration, starting at \$25. Retirees and/or spouses may also qualify.

- Healthy snacks (granola bars, peanut butter, crackers, cereal, etc.)
- 623 water bottles to keep the children hydrated
- 204 umbrellas to protect them from the rain so they don't have to sit in school all day with wet clothes.

"FALLING IS NOT A NORMAL PART OF AGING"

Falling can be prevented by addressing the risk factors in our homes and living areas. The Fire Department recently provided a presentation at St. John XXIII Catholic Church and the information is critical in keeping you healthy. They describe their goal as preventing you from having "One Bad Day" (a fall!). The acronym "AVOID FALLS" can help you to minimize some of those risk factors.

A = Awareness of Risk Factors

V = Vision (have it checked)

O = Other medical problems

= Imbalance (balance training is very helpful to prevent falls, and falls prevent fractures!)

D = Drug interactions (address your medications and over the counter medicines with your doctor)

F = Faulty Footware (closed toe sneakers and sturdy shoes are best)

A = Assistive Devices

L = Living space environment is free of trip

L = Level of activity is appropriate for your abilities

S = Step Wise Lee (a program to help prevent falls in Lee County)

BE SAFE, and if you have any of these risk factors, discuss them with your doctor.

For falls prevention resources, call the elder helpline at **800 963-5337** or call **911** for ALL medical emergencies. If you do fall and only need help getting back up, you can say "Lift Assist Only" if you call EMS/911. But it's much better to prevent that fall in the first place!



- Excessive sadness or moodiness: Long-lasting sadness, mood swings, and unexpected rage.
- Hopelessness: Feeling a deep sense of hopelessness about the future, with little expectation that circumstances can improve. Possible sleep issues.
- **Sudden calmness:** Suddenly becoming calm after a period of depression or moodiness can be a sign that the person has made a decision to end his or her life.
- Withdrawal: Choosing to be alone and avoiding friends or social activities also are possible symptoms of depression, a leading cause of suicide. This includes the loss of interest or pleasure in activities the person previously enjoyed.
- Changes in personality/appearance: A person who is considering suicide might exhibit a change in attitude or behavior, such as speaking or moving with unusual speed or slowness. In addition, the person might suddenly become less concerned about their personal appearance.
- Self-harmful behavior: Potentially dangerous behavior, such as reckless driving, engaging in unsafe sex, and increased use of drugs and/or alcohol might indicate that the person no longer values his or her life.
- Recent trauma or life crisis: A major life crises might trigger a suicide attempt. Crises include the death of a loved one or pet, divorce or break-up of a relationship, diagnosis of a major illness, loss of a job, or serious financial problems.
- Making preparations: Often, a person considering suicide will begin to put his or her personal business in order. This might include visiting friends and family members, giving away personal possessions, making a will, and cleaning up his or her room or home. Some people will write a note before committing suicide. Some will buy a firearm or other means like poison.
- **Threatening suicide:** 50% to 75% of those considering suicide will give someone a warning sign. However, not everyone will say so, or will follow through with it. Every threat of suicide should be taken seriously.

HEARING LOOP INSTALLED

IN THE PARISH LIFE CENTER

St. John XXIII installed a Hearing Loop in the Parish Life Center to assist those with hearing loss in order to hear more clearly during events, activities, and meetings. A Hearing Loop is an assistive listening system that transmits sound directly into one's hearing aids or cochlear implants rather than depending on sound coming from the loudspeakers. To receive the Loop signal and hear more clearly, manually activate your T-coil or telephone setting on your hearing aid or cochlear implant. If you don't know if you have a T-coil or whether yours is properly programmed, consult your audiologist or hearing aid professional. If you don't wear hearing aids, ask to use a Loop receiver to receive the sound.

HEARING LOOP BASICS:

How Does a Hearing Loop Work?

A Hearing Loop, through the use of a Loop amplifier and strategically placed wire around the room, transmits a signal (electromagnetically) that is received directly by and into a hearing aid or cochlear implant that has a T-coil installed in it or a special receiver for those who don't wear hearing devices.

What are the benefits of a Loop System?

Loop Systems help eliminate bothersome background noise and reverberation/echo. Additionally, Loops transmit sound directly into hearing aids and cochlear implants utilizing the prescriptive corrections that are programmed for that individual. No external receivers are required but are available for those without hearing devices.

What is a T-Coil?

A T-coil or Telecoil, is a small metal rod with metal wire wrapped around it that is installed in a hearing aid or cochlear implant which is necessary to receive the Loop signal. The other purpose of the T-coil is to make using the telephone easier by eliminating the high pitched interference you may hear when putting the phone to your ear.

How do I know if I have a T-Coil?

The T-coil program necessary for use with the Loop System is one that is manually activated by the user. This is done by either pressing a button on the hearing aid or cochlear implant itself or by use of a remote control. You may presently be pressing this button to use the telephone - It is the same program. If you are uncertain if you have a manual T-coil program, consult with your hearing professional as you may have one but it may not be activated.
